

Civil Service Commission To Accept Exam Forms

Applications are now being accepted for the 1963 Federal Service Entrance Examination given by the U.S. Civil Service Commission.

Applicants who apply by Thursday will be scheduled for the test Oct. 13. The place of testing will be named when the application is returned.

The examination is open to college juniors, seniors and graduates, regardless of their major, as well as to persons who have had equivalent academic experience.

Approximately 60 different occupational fields are open to civil service workers. A written test is required.

Six additional tests have been scheduled for Nov. 17, Jan. 12,

Feb. 9, March 16, April 20 and May 11.

Management internships will also be filled from the first examination. The application deadline for management internships is Jan. 24, 1963. For all other positions the closing date is April 25, 1963.

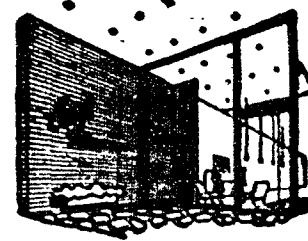
