

Trainer Jolley Scratches Ridan From Woodward Stakes

NEW YORK (AP) — Trainer LeRoy Jolley said yesterday that Ridan, definitely will not start Saturday against Kelso, Jaipur and others in the \$100,000-added Woodward Stakes at Aqueduct because of a cut foot.

Meanwhile a field of from six

to 10 is lining up for the 1 1/4 mile event, won last September by Bohemia Stable's Kelso, 1960 and 1961 horse of the year.

Jolley said a cut suffered in Monday's Discovery Handicap "is healing nicely, but we don't think it advisable to run in the Woodward."

Kelso and George D. Widener's

Jaipur, Belmont Stakes winner and top contender for the 3-year-old title, are certain starters along with Hobeau Farm's Beau Purple, Robert Lehman's Ambio-poise, Preston Madden's T. V. Lark, and Ogden Phipps' Hitting Away. Beau Purple won the Suburban and Brooklyn Handicaps, beating Kelso in the Suburban.
