

### South Halls Alters Voting Procedure

The AWS voting procedure for the South Halls Area Council has been changed because of Ewing Hall's designation as a women's residence hall.

In the primary elections, 21 candidates will be chosen as voters select three coeds from each of the seven residence halls. Ten of the 21 candidates will be

chosen as council members on the final election day.

The seven women polling the most votes in their respective residence halls will be named to the council, and the two freshmen and one upperclassman receiving the most votes among the remaining 14 candidates will be elected the council's members-at-large.
