

IFC Amends Scholarship Rule

The Interfraternity Council amended their new scholarship probation requirement last night making it retroactive for two terms.

The new probation requirement as passed last week states that if a fraternity is below a 2.35 house average or 25 per cent of its members have below a 2.00 term average, the house is on academic probation.

THE NEW REQUIREMENT also states that if a fraternity falls below the scholarship requirement for three terms, it will not be permitted to participate in Greek Week or Spring Week. If it is below the requirement for four terms, it will not be eligible to participate in intramural activities.

quirement was retroactive for four terms which placed 11 fraternities on academic probation. Under the new amendment, if these fraternities raise their averages at the end of the fall term, they will be off probation and eligible to participate in Spring Week and Greek Week. If they raise their average by the end of winter term they will be eligible to participate in Spring Week but not in Greek Week which is scheduled for the winter term.

In other business, IFC approved changes in the Fraternity President's Guide in regards to door duty.

The new rule states that two members of the fraternity or official pledges must be on door duty whenever a social function is held in the house.
