

## Trustees Approve Sketch Plans For 3 Campus Building Projects

Sketch plans for three building projects at the University have been approved by the Board of Trustees, Walter H. Wiegand, director of physical plant, said yesterday.

The trustees have approved plans for additions to Willard and Pattee Library and for the first unit of a physical sciences building.

The addition to Willard, consisting primarily of classrooms, will be located to the east of the present structure, extending from Pollock Road south along the Mall, Wiegand said.

The library addition will be constructed to the west of the main building, he said. A duplicate wing to the east is also under consideration, he added.

The physical sciences unit to be located south of Graduate Hall, will be the first portion of a large structure extending from the Psy-

chology Laboratory north of Schwab to Osmond.

The sketch plans will now be returned to the General State Authority so that architects can proceed with final plans, he said.

Although the GSA allocated funds for the design and planning of the buildings last year, Wiegand said, appropriations for actual construction will not be requested until final architects' plans have been submitted.

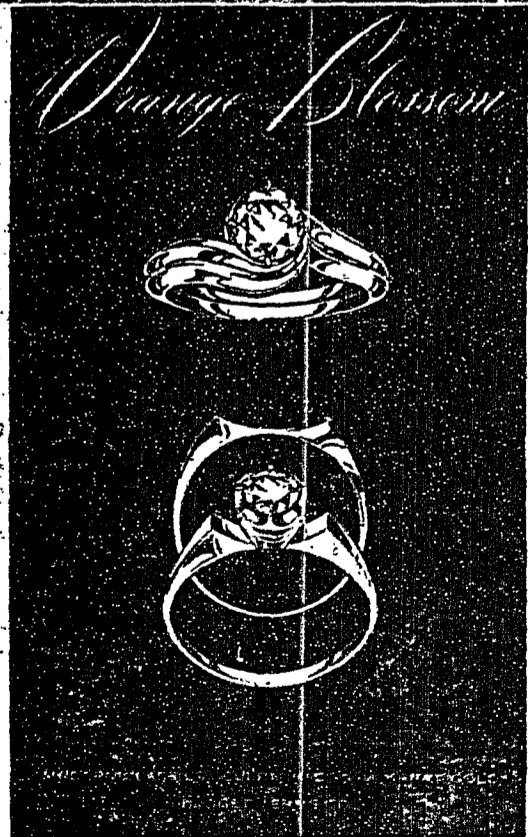
