

# Alard String Quartet to Play Tonight

The Alard String Quartet, now in residence at the University, will present its first concert of the season at 8:30 tonight in Schwab. The concert is open to the public. The quartet, composed of violinists Donald Hopkins and Joanne Zagst, violist Raymond Page and cellist Leonard Feldman, was formed by Hans Letz at the Juilliard School of Music in New York City in 1954.

AFTER A YEAR of junior residency at the University of Texas, the quartet took up a similar position at Wilmington College, Wilmington, Ohio.

In addition to many concerts in American cities, the Quartet made an extensive tour of Mexico last year under the auspices of the U.S. Information Service.

The Quartet will be giving concerts throughout the year and will also assist the music faculty in several courses.

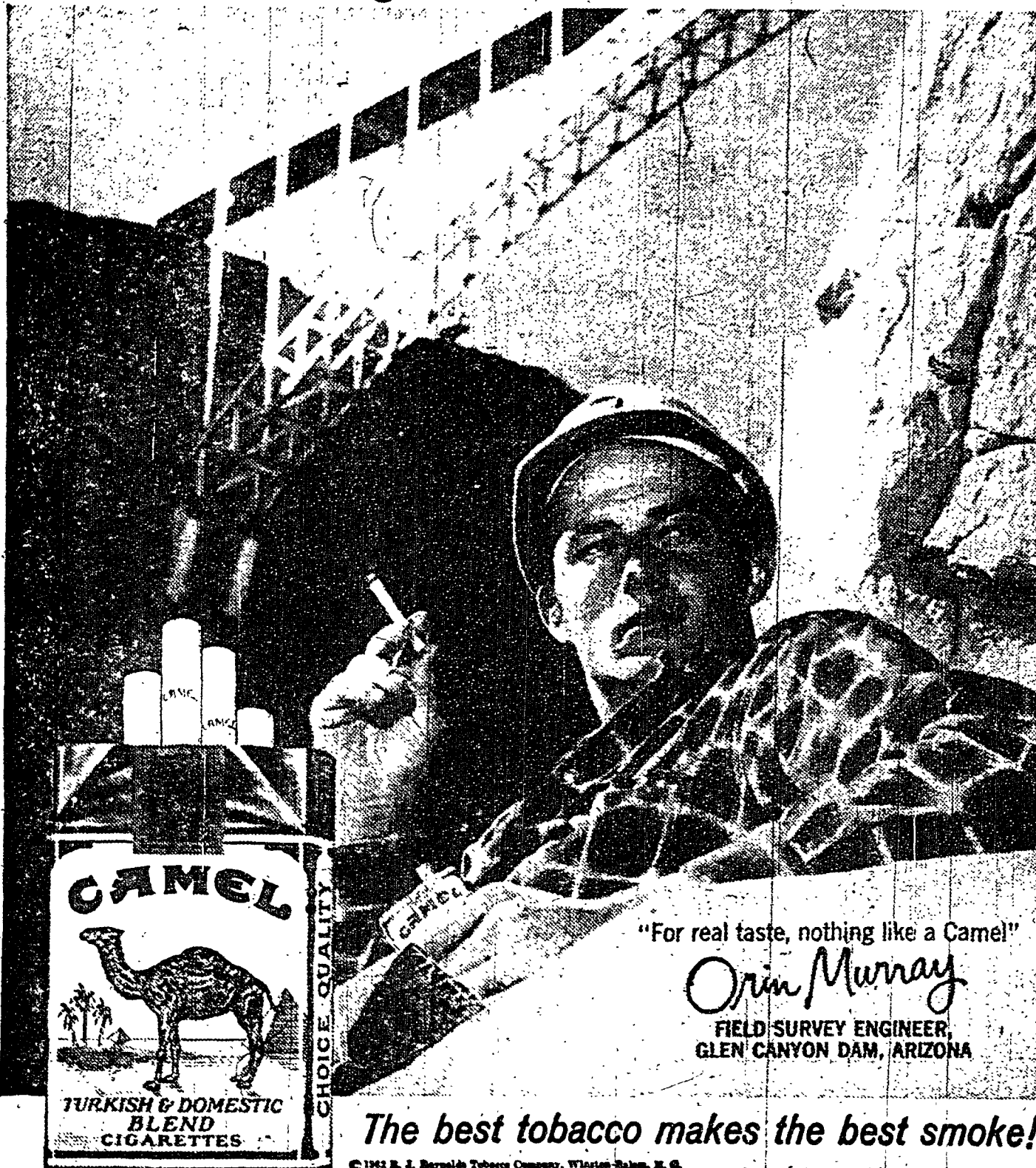
