

College Planning OK'd in January

General plans for the new College of Arts and Architecture were completed last summer, culminating almost six months of discussion, John R. Rackley, vice president for resident education, said yesterday.

Planning began, he said, after President Eric A. Walker received a letter from Ben Euwema, dean of the College of the Liberal Arts, and Jules Heller, director of the School of the Arts. The letter indicated all was not working well in the school, Rackley said, adding that he was asked to look into the problem.

THE IDEA of joining the three departments of the School of the Arts—art, music and theater arts—with the landscape architecture curriculum of the Department of Horticulture was accepted in the early planning stages.

The landscape architecture curriculum had been surveyed as a part of the University's self-evaluation program; a recommendation of the evaluation was that it be raised to department status and relocated.

A similar change had also been recommended for the architecture

curriculum of the College of Engineering and Architecture, Rackley added.

Organizational, book keeping and admissions matters are being ironed out now, he said.
