

### Beta Sig Wins Help Week Trophy

The Alpha Tau Omega Help Week Trophy, awarded yearly to the fraternity that has done the most to improve fraternity-State College relations, was given last night to Beta Sigma Rho at the Intrafraternity Council meeting.

The award is given as an incentive to replace "hell" week with a "help" week during which members of a fraternity work on a worthwhile project. The Beta Sigma Rho project was a party for 35 underprivileged children of State College.

Author of "The Metropolitan Seminars in Art," "Mainstreams in Modern Art" and "Embattled Critic," Canaday has also written many magazine articles.

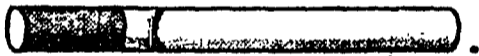

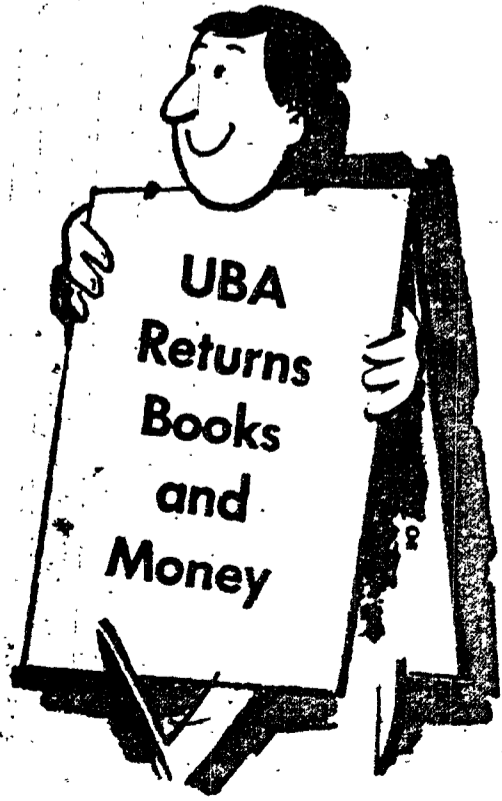
