

Masich Makes Golf Debut By Qualifying for Tourney

Sophomore Barry Masich, competing in his first intercollegiate varsity golf match, fired an eight-over-par 79 for State on the Naval Academy Course at Annapolis to place fifth in the regional E.C.A.C. Fall Tournament and pace the Lions to a fourth place finish in team play.

The score qualified Masich for the E.C.A.C. finals to be held at Beth Page Park, Long Island, N.Y., on Oct. 20. Navy's Jim Seeley finished first in the regional round with a one-over-par 72.

THREE OTHER Lion linksmen who made the trip with coach Joe Boyle — Jim Tabor, Roland Gartner and Dave Liebau — failed to score below the 81 cut-off mark.

Taber, undefeated in 12 matches during the regular season last spring, shot an 85 and Liebau, a semi-finalist in the 1961 spring E.I.G.A. Tournament, shot an 84.

Captain-elect Roland Gartner fired an 83 to lead the trio of veteran Nittany golfers. The three were apparently hurt most by

flubbing on just a few holes, but nevertheless erring badly enough so that the miscues proved costly in the final tally.

For example, Gartner ran into ill fortune on one hole and came up with an eight. Had he stroked a five, he would have qualified.

"The course was wet because three inches of rain fell the day before," coach Boyle said yesterday, "but the weather was ideal for golfing. Only five players broke 80 which goes to show that the course wasn't in the very best of condition."

Navy won the regional championship with 321, followed by Georgetown (326), Penn (327) and the Lions (331). The entire Navy team will proceed to Beth Park and compete for team laurels with three other sectional champions.

Masich qualified for the finals by shooting a consistent game. As a freshman last year, Masich earned the nickname "varsity killer" for impressive showings against varsity members of the golf team.

Stickmen Open Fall Practice With New Coach

Varsity lacrosse coach Bill Hess got his first look at this year's Lion squad when they opened three weeks of fall practice yesterday.

Hess, a former Lion great and holder of the State records for most goals in a game, season and career, is starting his first year

as head coach. He replaces Dick Pencek, who in his one year as coach, led State to its best season in history, 7-3.

Pencek has since been called into the military service. He is presently serving as an assistant lacrosse coach at West Point.

Hess is by no means a stranger to the coaching wars. He has been an assistant at John Hopkins, considered to be one of the perennial powerhouses in lacrosse circles.

While a player for the Lions, Hess was considered to be the greatest to ever wear the Blue and White.
