

Women Will Vote For AWS Councils

In the rush of fall elections, women students will elect 30 members of Association of Women Students community Councils today.

The polls will be open from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and from 4:30 to 7 p.m. in all residence hall areas. The polls will be located in East, Pollock and Redifer dining halls and in Simmons, McElwain, Atherton and McKee lounges.

EACH WOMAN must present her matriculation card and meal ticket and sign for the ballot she receives in order to vote. All incomplete ballots will be tallied but write-in votes will be disregarded.

APPROXIMATELY 300 positions are available on the 10 councils, he said.

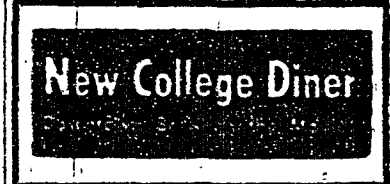
Education, Liberal Arts, Divi-
