

'Times' Critic to Speak on Art

The author of seven mystery novels as well as other books and art critic for The New York Times, John Canaday, will speak on "Some Problems in Modern Art" at 8:30 p.m. Friday in Schwab. His appearance is being sponsored by the University Lecture Series.

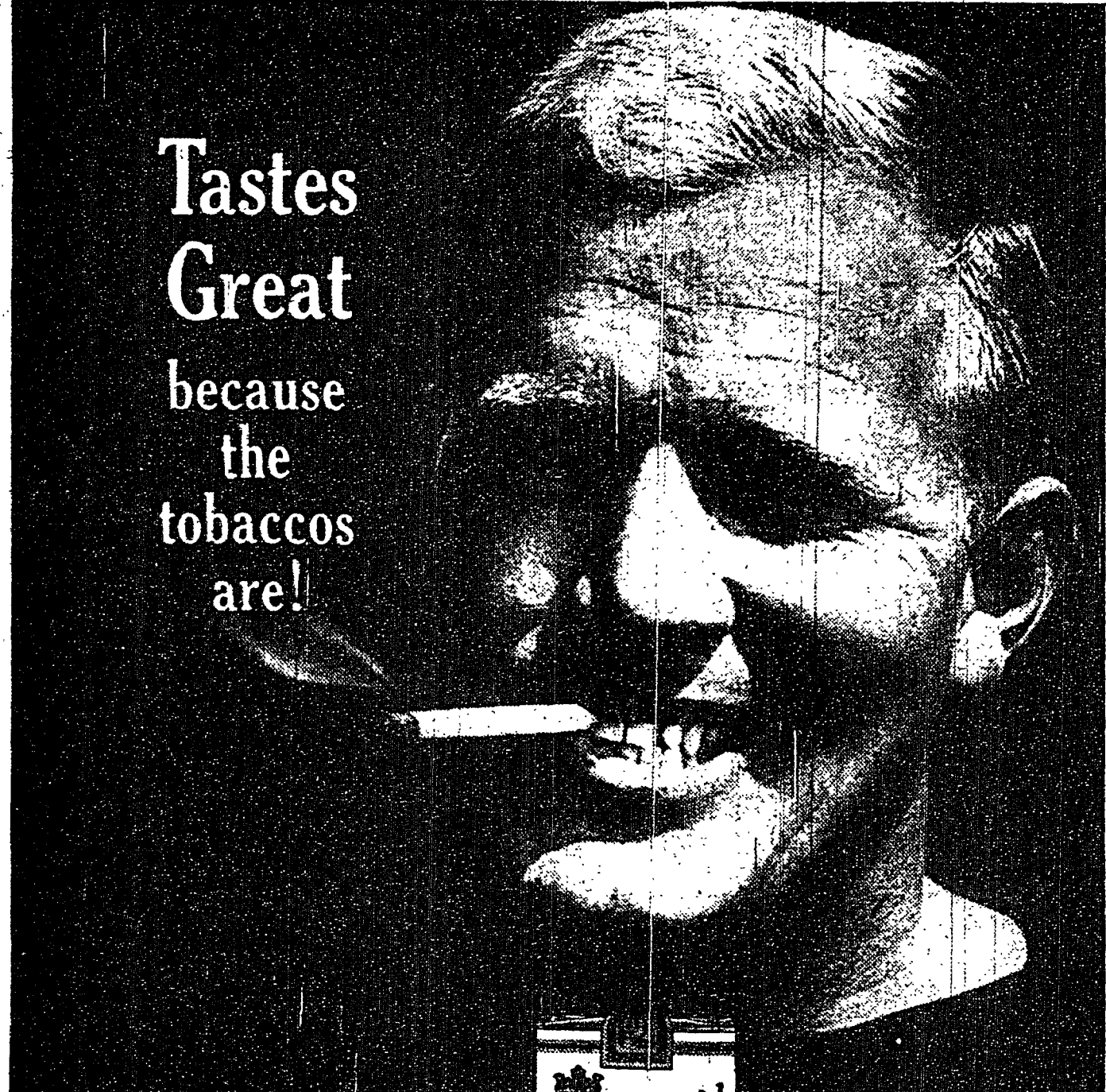
