More than 50 countries are available for pre-doctoral re-search and study. Britain, France and Germany absorb more than .300 of the 700 available grants.

There are three types of grants available for study abroad. The Full Grants provide round-trip transportation, language or orien-tation course, tuition, books and maintenance for one academic vear.

The second type, the Joint U.S.-Other Government Grants provide tuition and full or partial main-tenance Travel is provided by the U.S. Government.

It is also possible to apply for a Travel-Only Grant to supplement maintenance and tuition scholar-ships granted to American students by foreign governments, universities and private donors.




