The pep rally for the Penn State-Army game tomorrow had begun.

The 12 cheerleaders showed their pep by twisting, with the band supplying twist music. Joseph Castiglia, (4th—business administration—Passaic, N.J.), who emceed the rally, asked the crowd to show its enthusiasm by cheering loudly enough so that the patients in Ritenour Health Center could hear them.

CASTIGLIA, Paul Krow, president of the Block "S" Club, and the cheerleaders led the crowd in cheers and songs including "State," "Nittany" and "Victory."

Sorority Rush Outlined

A period of limited contact, during which rushees may visit the rooms of sorority women but not sorority suites, has been established in the Panhellenic formal rush code for 1962-63.

This period will be in effect from sorority open houses Nov. 11 until formal rush registration Jan. 3. During this time, sorority women may not visit rooms of rushees or spend money on them.

They may, however, attend the same parties during Christmas vacation, with the provision that a sorority woman does not invite a rushee to her party.

ALL WOMEN interested in rush must register for sorority open houses from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Oct. 24 and 25 in the Hetzel Union main lounge. Open houses will be held Nov. 11, 17 and 18.

Registration for formal sorority rush will take place from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Jan. 3 and 4 in the HUB main lounge. The first round of 30-minute chatter dates will be held Jan. 5 and 6.

The second round of chatter dates, lasting one hour each, will be held Jan. 8 and 9. Bermuda junctions will take place from 6:15 to 10:30 p.m. Jan. 11.

RUSHEES will attend two coffee hours, from 6:15 to 7:30 and 8:30 to 10 p.m., Jan. 13. Ribboning will take place at 7 p.m. Jan. 14 in the sorority suites.

From formal rush registration Jan. 3 until ribboning, a period of strict silence will exist. Con-

tacts between sorority women and rushees will be limited to scheduled rush parties. With the exceptions of classrooms and the Penn State "hello," other contacts must be approved by the Panhellenic office.

There may be no refreshments or entertainment at the open houses and first round of chatter dates. Accompanied singing will be permitted at the chatter dates, but no accompaniment may be used for singing at the open houses.

INFORMAL GAMES and soft drinks are allowed for the second round of chatter dates. At Bermuda junctions, a 20-minute skit and refreshments are permitted but no favors may be given to rushees.

Decorations, ceremonies, refreshments and favors are permitted for coffee hours, which will be held in sorority suites. Rushees will be taken directly to their rush/guide meeting place following the second coffee hour to sign their preferentials.

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
