University Suspends 2 Frosh

Two 1st term students were suspended from the University by the Senate Subcommittee on Discipline, Daniel R. Leasure, assisttant dean of men, said yesterday.

A freshman in liberal arts was suspended until the end of the Spring term 1963 for drinking as a minor and disorderly and disrespectful behavior, Leasure said.
