Record Crowd Expected at Stadium; Drivers Urged to Use Main Routes

An estimated 10,000 to 12,000 cars will jam the roads and highways leading to Beaver Stadium today as more than 48,000 fans are expected to attend the Penn State-Syracuse football game.

Because there will be 2,000 more cars than usual, an acute traffic problem is foreseen by John R. Juba, State College police chief. Motorists should follow the main routes to the stadium via Park Ave., University Drive, and Porter Rd.

There is no access to Stadium parking lots from inner campus

and drivers should not travel on Shortlidge Road unless absolutely necessary, Juba said.

Pedestrians are urged to use Curtin Road and to stay off the highways, he said.

Plenty of parking space will be available. However it will take some time to get all the cars in and out of the lots before and after the game.

Juba also asked the cooperation of local residents in following the established patterns and suggested that borough residents and fraternity groups explain the traffic pattern to their guests.

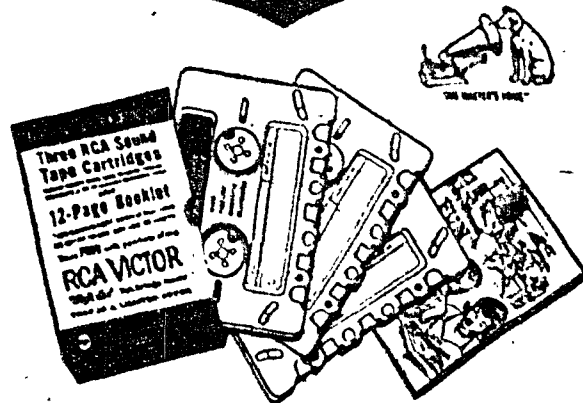

Riley's "conservative guess" is that 20,000 of the 48,000 expected to attend today's football game with Syracuse will be alumni, their families and friends.

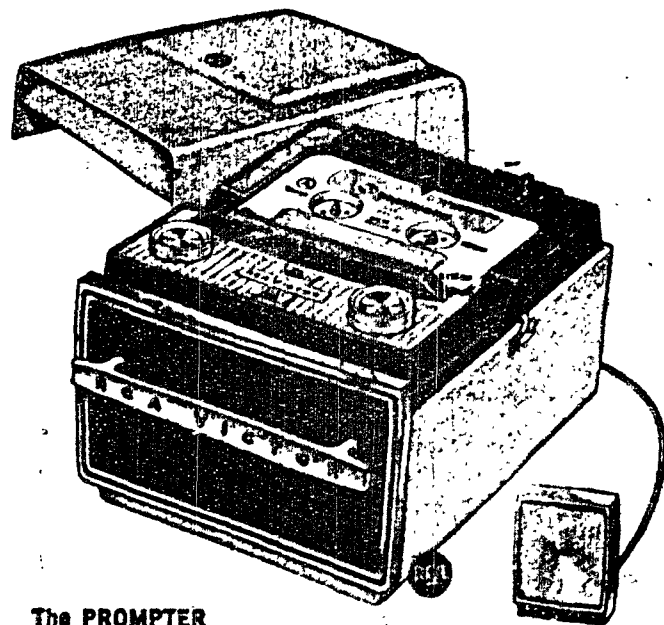
