Record Crowd Expected at Stadium; Drivers Urged to Use Main Routes

An estimated 10,000 to 12,000 and drivers should not travel on cars will jam the roads and highways leading to Beaver Stadium today as more than 48,000 fans are expected to attend the Penn State-Syracuse football game.

Because there will be 2,000 more cars than usual, an acute traffic problem is forseen by John R. Juba, State College police chief. Motorists should follow the main routes to the stadium via Park Ave., University Drive, and Porter Rd.

There is no access to Stadium parking lots from inner campus pattern to their guests.

Pedestrians are urged to use Curtin Road and to stay off the

highways, he said.


