

# Action on Cuba Asked

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) —The United States called on the U.N. Security Council yesterday to act now on Cuba and halt what it charged is a vast plan by Soviet communism to win world domination by "piecemeal aggression."

In somber words, U.S. Ambassador Adlai E. Stevenson told the 11-nation council that the flow of Soviet missiles and other offensive weapons to Cuba is "a grave threat to the Western Hemisphere and the peace of the world."

He asserted that the United States in coping with that threat is prepared to meet aggression with resistance, and "force with force."

STEVENSON SPOKE in support of a U.S. resolution demanding that the council order the Soviet Union to remove all the offensive weapons and missiles it has sent to Cuba.

A U.S. spokesman said the United States is sure it will get at least seven votes for its resolution.

A Soviet veto is regarded as certain. In that event the United States is expected to put the issue before the 109-nation General Assembly.

TO HEAD OFF what would be a bitter assembly session, Ghana and the United Arab Republic

were reported trying to work out a resolution aimed at bridging the gap between the United States and the Soviet Union. A meeting of non-aligned nations was called to consider possible steps.

Stevenson charged that Cuban Prime Minister Fidel Castro has decided to turn his country into a base for "putting all the Americas under the nuclear gun and thereby intensify the Soviet diplomacy of blackmail in every part of the world."

He put this challenge to the council:

"The time has come for this council to decide whether to make a serious attempt to bring peace to the world—or to let the United Nations stand idly by while the vast plan of piecemeal aggression unfolds, conducted in the hope that no single issue will seem consequential enough to mobilize the resistance of the free peoples."

HE DEALT HARSHLY with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev,

charging that the Soviet Leader is determined "to destroy the hope of a pluralistic world order" and make all the world Communist.

He accused Khrushchev of a long succession of aggressive acts and expressed hope the Soviet leader had not mistaken forbearance for weakness.

"We cannot believe," Stevenson added, "that he has deluded himself into supposing that though we have the power, we lack nerve; that though we have weapons, we are without the will to use them."

Stevenson took the floor as the first speaker in the debate.

He was in conference with other U.N. delegations almost up until the hour he delivered his speech.

# China Proposes Cease-Fire in India

TOKYO (AP) — Red China proposed yesterday a cease-fire and troop pullback along the bitterly contested India-China border. The Chinese also called for a summit conference of Prime Minister Nehru and Premier Chou En-lai to settle the border dispute. Peiping proposed that troops of

both nations pull back 20 kilometers—12.5 miles—from where the fighting is now going on.

If India agrees, Peiping said, the Chinese would be willing to withdraw its troops in the north-eastern border sector where they have penetrated into territory long claimed and occupied by India.

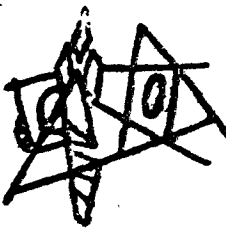
