

Arctic Air Arrives, Cold Weather Expected to Continue

Temperatures dropped sharply yesterday with the arrival of unseasonably cold arctic air. The cold weather is forecast to continue for several days.

The mercury hovered around the 50 degree mark yesterday morning and early afternoon, and

then dipped into the low 40's during the late afternoon.

Considerable cloudiness, windy and cold weather is indicated for today, and a few light showers or snow flurries are likely. The high will be about 49 degrees.

Frost and freezing temperatures

are seen for tonight. The low should be near 30 degrees.

Sunny and cold weather is forecast for tomorrow.
