

Frozen Fans See Delta Sig Top SAE

More than a hundred spectators lined the frozen, windswept golf course IM fields last night to see Delta Sigma Phi squeeze by Sigma Alpha Epsilon, 2-0.

On the game's opening series of plays, Karl Ohrman tagged SAE's quarterback Ed Horst in the end zone for the winning margin.

Low temperatures kept scoring to a minimum, an exception being Kappa Delta Rho, who overran Phi Epsilon Pi, 21-0. KDR quarterback Bill Johnston threw three TD passes and booted three extra points.

In another fraternity battle, Acacia defeated Pi Kappa Alpha on first downs in a battle between two previously unbeaten teams.

One first down was the margin of victory for Delta Chi in its clash with Omega Psi Phi, the game also featuring a disputed call that has led Omega Psi Phi to protest the game.

The play came on Omega Psi Phi's second half kickoff to Delta Chi. After a Delta Chi player presumably touched the football, it rolled into the end zone where

an Omega Psi Phi player pounced on the ball. Omega Psi Phi claimed a TD but the play was ruled a touchback and taken out to the 20-yard line. The IM office will decide on the validity of the claim.

In two other fraternity battles,

Sigma Pi defeated Sigma Chi, 7-0; and Delta Theta Sigma won over Zeta Psi, 7-0.

On the West Halls front, Walnut dropped Cottonwood, 6-0, while Sycamore edged Watts I and Chestnut squeaked by Butternut on first downs.

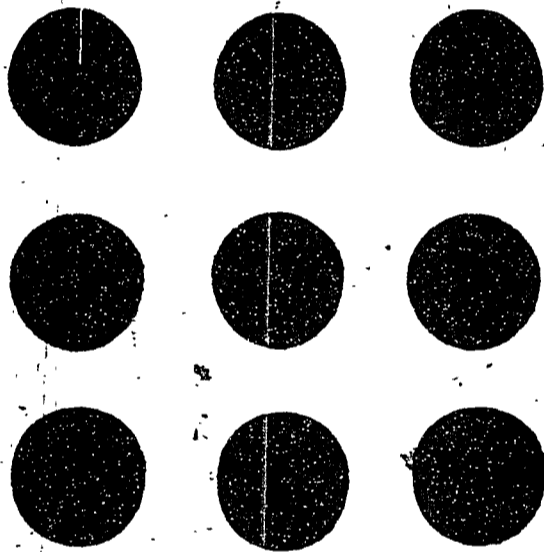
