

Discipline Subcommittee Places Three Students on Probation

Three students have been placed on disciplinary probation until the end of the spring term 1963 by the Senate Subcommittee on Discipline, Daniel R. Leasure, assistant dean of men, said yesterday.

Disciplinary probation involves an official notation on the student's transcript and limitation of their extracurricular activities.

Leasure said the students — a 7th term liberal arts major, a 1st term chemistry and physics major and a 1st term home economics major — were apprehended by a University official while they were drinking alcoholic beverages in an automobile parked on a campus parking lot.

The three refused to present matriculation cards or to identify

themselves to the official, Leasure said.

He said the official termed the students' behavior "uncooperative and offensive."

In addition to the disciplinary probation, the committee directed that the liberal arts major, owner and operator of the automobile, be forbidden to maintain and drive an automobile on campus or in Centre County while a student.

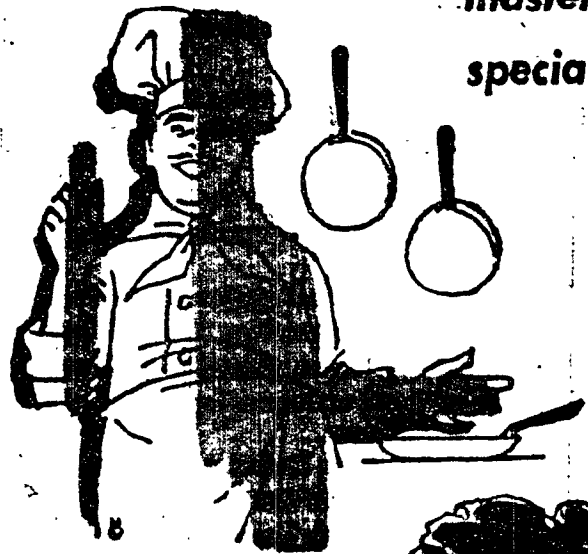

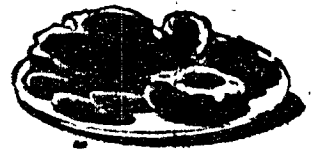
