

Town Seats on Congress Questioned

Since the correct number of residents living downtown is unavailable, the area's representation on the Undergraduate Student Government Congress remains in question, George Jackson, Elections Commission chairman, said Thursday.

Six congressmen from the town area were sworn in at Wednesday night's Congress meeting. A seventh representative, Alan Wolf, also took the oath.

However, this act did not offi-

cially make him a congressman, USG President Dean Wharton said. Technically Wolf was never officially declared a winner in the election, Jackson said. If the town area should have seven representatives, then Wolf will be declared a winner, he added.

Registration Shows Increase of 700 Over Last Fall

Enrollment for the fall term totals 23,584, a gain of more than 700 students over the 22,855 of a year ago.

In announcing the final figures yesterday, Robert G. Bernreuter, dean of admissions and registrar, said that 15,220 under-

graduates, including 9,980 men and 5,240 women, are included in the 17,668 total for the University Park campus. There are also 2,131 graduate students and 317 special students enrolled at University Park.

The University Park total a year ago was 17,407. A total of 5,916 students are enrolled at other campuses and centers of the University, a gain of nearly 500 over the 5,448 reported a year ago.

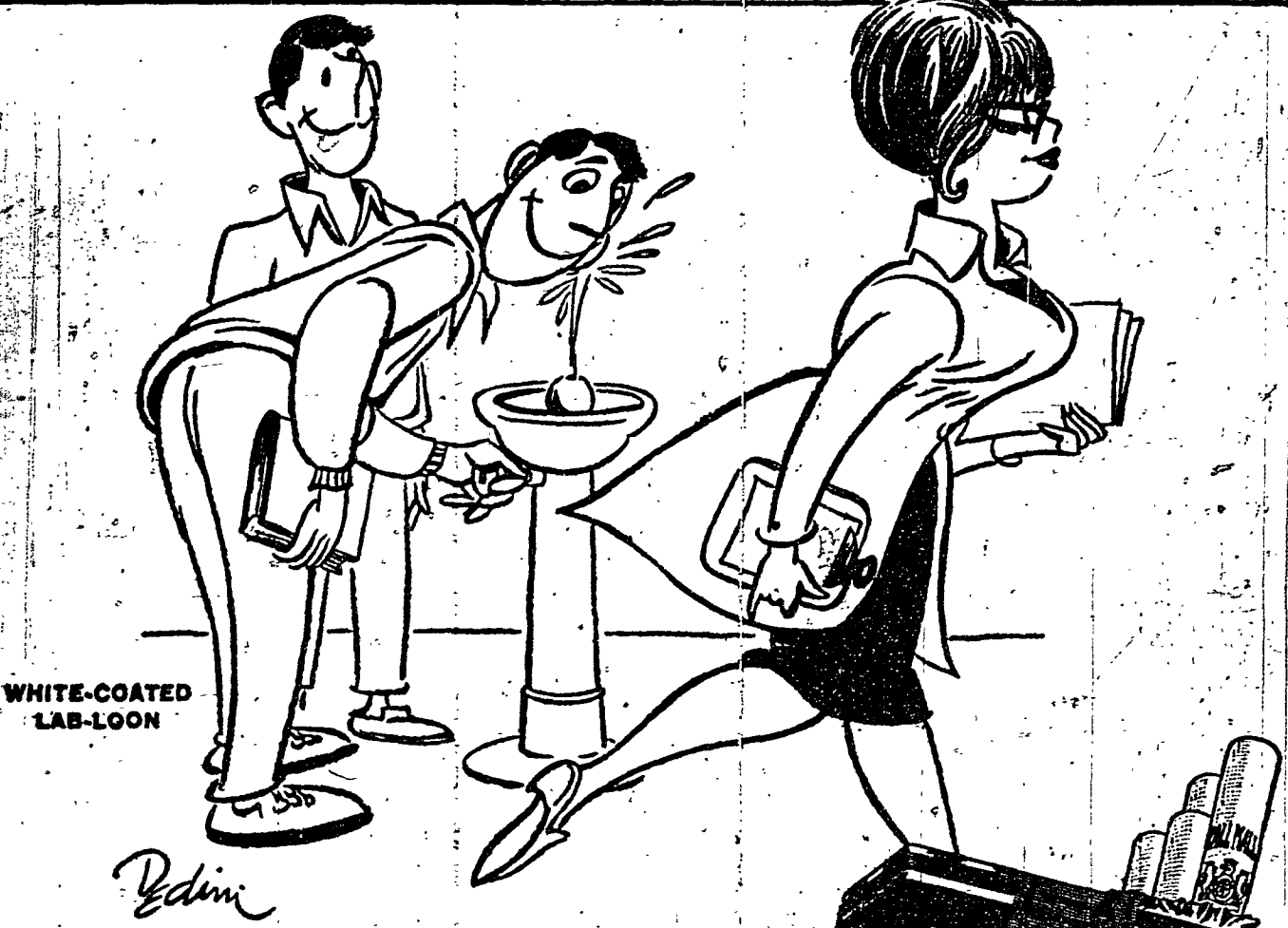
