But we feel Dilworth's plan or any plan for expanding and improving education in this state can be greatly implemented by the creation of an educational division whose sole purpose it would be to study, plan and, most important, carry out these plans for the people of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Viewing the stands, and the presentation of these stands by both Scranton and Dilworth, we see strong and weak points on both sides. In our minds, however, the merits accredited to Scranton outweigh those of Dilworth in the race for governor.

Regardless of concurring or dissenting opinions, we urge every student to vote for the candidate of his choice tomorrow and those students who are eligible to vote next Tuesday in the 1962 General Election.

It is imperative to exercise this privilege for the fate of this University and of the state of Pennsylvania rests on active and intelligent participation at the polls.

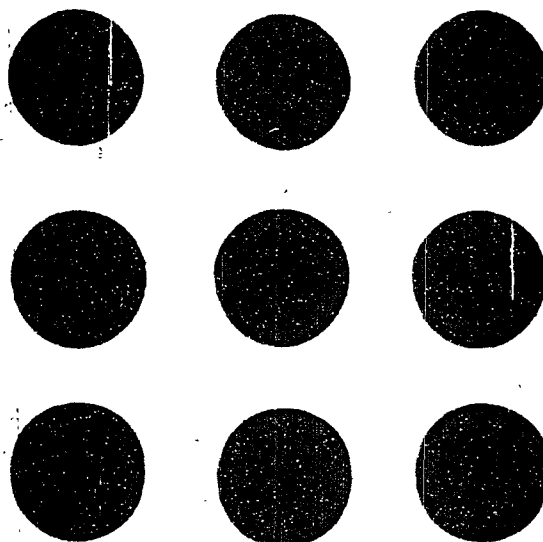
