

Coed Behavior Problems Increase, Women Seek More Counseling Aid

The number of coeds seeking counseling and those displaying "erratic behavior" has increased in recent weeks, Jeanette Berry, staff assistant to the dean of women, told the Association of Women Students Senate last night.

The sharp increase in these cases has been primarily among freshman and sophomore women, she explained.

Miss Berry urged the AWS members to alert their community councils to the problem, which she termed "most serious." They should encourage coeds who seem to be having problems to seek aid, she said.

Several attempted suicide cases have also been reported, Miss Berry said.

Possible reasons have been given for this increase of behavioral problems with the most obvious being the increased pressures of the term system and parents pressing for students to achieve higher grades, she ex-

plained. Other theories are being investigated by the dean of women's staff and John Walmer, University psychiatrist, she added.

In other business, Janis Somerville, AWS president, announced the appointment of Marjorie Moran (4th-arts and letters-Pittsburgh) to replace Barbara Baer (7th-arts and letters-Mount Vernon, N.Y.), who resigned as chairman of the AWS committee on educational affairs. Miss Baer was recently elected to the Undergraduate Student Government Congress.

Noted Architect to Visit Department As Critic
