

SPE Edges Phi Sigma Kappa, 12-6

Led by the fine passing of Jerry Kozusko, Sigma Phi Epsilon edged Phi Sigma Kappa 12-6 in intramural gridiron action last evening on the golf course fields.

The contest was evenly matched throughout, but a pair of touchdown aeriels by Kozusko made the difference.

After a scoreless first half, during which Phi Sigma Kappa registered three first downs to its opponents' none, SPE tallied twice within three minutes after intermission.

Kozusko hit Jan Miller with a 34-yard touchdown pass to give SPE a 6-0 lead. Moments later, the flashy quarterback found the range again, this time rifling a 38-yard bomb to Jim Paulson to up the advantage to 12-0.

But Phi Sigma Kappa was not out of the game yet. Its big break

came when Dave Teather pounced on an SPE fumble on the SPE one. On the first play from scrimmage, a Jack Michener to Jay Stockett pass made the score 12-6.

Phi Sigma Kappa intercepted a pair of SPE passes late in the game, but could not score.

A spectacular 63-yard pass play from Richie Brönnner to Howie Garelick gave Beta Sigma Rho a tight 6-2 win over Alpha Phi Delta.

Zeta Beta Tau knocked off Sigma Tau Gamma 5-0 on first downs after the game ended in a 3-3 deadlock.

Sigma Tau took an early lead on Dick Hocker's 21-yarder, but Ronnie Bowitz knotted the count

late in the game with a 10-yard boot.

In another tight defensive tilt, Theta Chi squeaked by Alpha Epsilon Pi, 6-0, on Burt Rudy's 18-yard touchdown pass to Al Thompson.

Charlie Kneller kicked a 27-yard field goal late in the second half to give Pi Kappa Phi a 3-0 win over Phi Kappa Psi.

Fine defensive play and intercepted passes featured the Alpha Tau Omega-Alpha Gamma Rho game, which ended in a scoreless tie. AGR took the win on first downs, 4-2.

Coach Lauds U.S. All-Star Team

NEW YORK (AP) — Coach Omar (Bud) Browning is high on the U.S. All-Stars who will meet the touring National Russian team in a series of eight basketball games starting at Madison Square Garden Nov. 8.

"I think we have the finest amateur talent in the United States working out here," Browning advised AAU headquarters in New York yesterday.

"Our toughest job will be to cut the 18-man squad to 12," said Browning, who is sending the squad through its paces at Bartlesville, Okla.

"Seven of the 10 players picked on the 1962 All-American AAU team are trying out for the 12-man squad, including Gary

Thompson of the Phillips 66ers, most valuable player in this year's AAU tournament," said Browning.

The three U.S. centers are Lloyd Sharrar (6-10), formerly of West Virginia, Mike Moran (6-9) of Marquette and Harold Hudgens (6-10) of Texas Tech. Moran played for the Denver Truckers and Sharrar for the Akron Good-years.

The Russians, due to arrive in New York Monday, also are bringing over their national women's team, winners of the European championship.

Doubleheaders involving the men's and women's teams will be featured at each of the eight stops.
