

### Former Peace Corps Executive Will Speak at Chapel Service

Lawrence E. Dennis, executive associate for the American Council on Education, Washington, D.C. and a former University vice president, will speak at the 10:55 a.m. Chapel service tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium. His topic will be "The Peace Corps: Mission for Our Time."

Dennis joined the University staff in 1954 and was named vice president for academic affairs in 1957. In 1961 he was appointed associate director of the Peace Corps.

The Rev. Donald McIlvride, director of the Westminster Foundation, will speak on "The Christian Calling" at the 9 a.m. service in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel tomorrow.

### Borough Council Will Consider Housing Code

The State College Borough Council will meet at 7:30 p.m. Monday at the Borough Building to consider the enactment of a housing code designed to protect the health, safety and welfare of students living off-campus.

If approved, the housing code would become effective Jan. 1. Its provisions would be enforced by June 1, allowing a period for property owners to elevate housing to standards established in the code.

There is some speculation that fraternity houses which are off-

campus would come under the jurisdiction of the code.

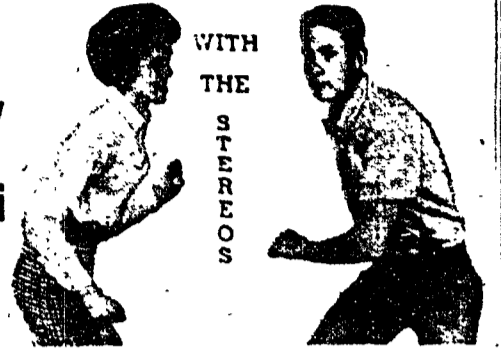
Arthur Pergam, Town Independent Men's Council president, said that he is in accord with the context of the code with the exception of section 304 and 1101, which concern heating.

A building code has also been prepared. The building code would dictate regulations for all construction, while the housing code deals with safety and health regulations in rental units.

This code will only be considered if the housing code is passed.

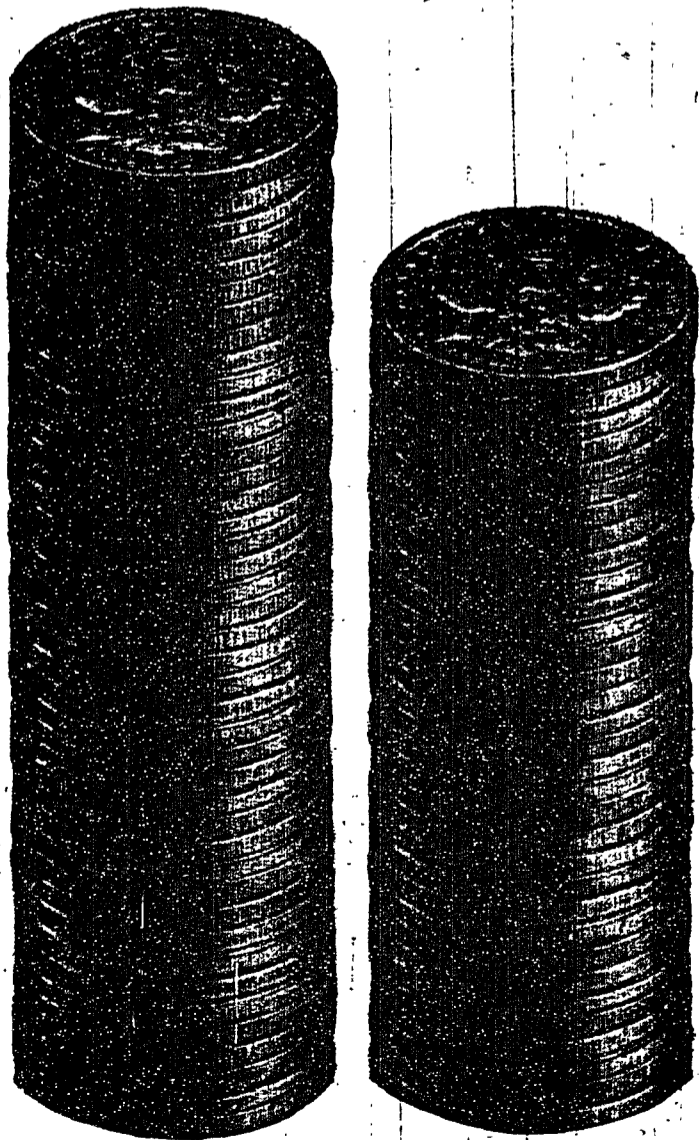
