Leasure said the students admitted having two coeds in their apartment who were found to be missing from their residence hall after sign-in time.

Also suspended until the end of the fall term 1962 was a 7th term liberal arts student,/he said.

The student was apprehended by a local store manager for shoplifting after plcking up a bottle of liquid make-up. The student intended to use the make-up for a Halloween party, Leasure explained.

A FOURTH term business administration student was placed on disciplinary probation until the end of the winter term 1963 for drinking in a residence hall and creating a disturbance, he said.


