

Nixon Bids Politics Bitter Farewell

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Richard M. Nixon bade a caustic farewell to politics yesterday. He conceded Democratic Gov. Edmund G. Brown had beaten him for governor of California and blamed the press for his downfall.

The 49-year-old Republican former vice president waited until 10 a.m. before congratulating Brown as the winner of Tuesday's election.

BROWN, 57, led from the start, held a 250,000-vote margin when Nixon conceded, and had claimed victory nine hours earlier.

"I believe Gov. Brown has a heart even though he believes I do not. I believe he's a good American even though he believes I'm not," Nixon told newsmen in Beverly Hills.

In his 1 a.m. victory statement,

Brown had praised Nixon as a vigorous opponent, and congratulated him on the race he ran. Nixon told reporters it was his last press conference and said they hadn't reported that he had defended Brown's patriotism and motives.

At one point, he said reporters had written it the way they saw it, but added, "I don't think pub-

lishers should order reporters to write it one way or another.

"If newspapers are against a candidate, they should say it," Nixon said.

"But I think at least they should report what a candidate has to say."

THE COUNT from 26,338 of California's 31,820 precincts was Brown 2,438,802, Nixon 2,001,661.

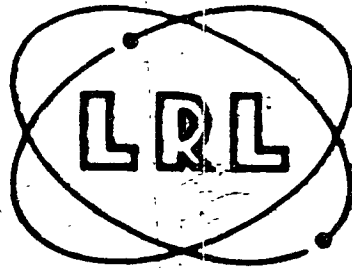
