# CD Alert System Fails Test

Thursday's series of civil defense drills proved that the amplification system in Old Main Tower will not be adequate for a full alert in case of an emergency. "We will have to get another system of alarm because the Old Main Tower isn't adequate with the present equipment," William

F. Fatula, chairman of the committee to expand the University civil defense program said.

The test was conducted with a recorded siren and voice count from Old Main, and a fire whistle from the power plant.

Fatula said after an analysis another test series will be planned.
