

Smith Appointed Visiting Journ Prof

Henry L. Smith, professor of journalism and former director of the School of Communications at the University of Washington in Seattle, has been named distinguished visiting professor of journalism for the winter term 1963. The 56-year-old historian and educator will teach a course in the history of journalism and communications. Smith is the author of three histories. His latest, "The Press and America," written with Edwin Emery, has been the required text at the University for the course Smith will be teaching. Smith's other books are aeronautical histories.

Warmer Temperatures Expected Tomorrow Afternoon

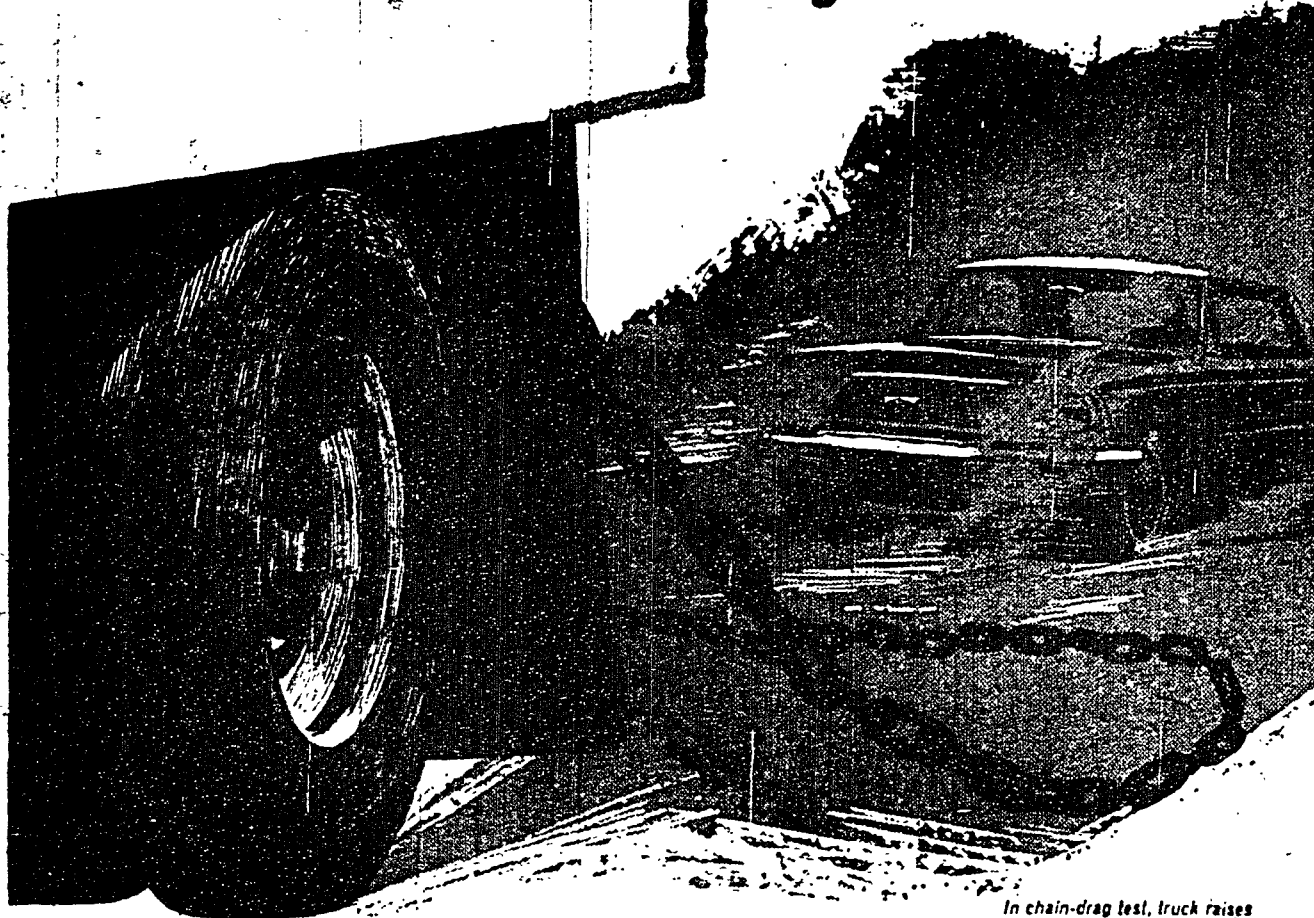
