

Miss Agriculture '62 Crowned At 13th Annual Ag Hill Party

Linda Hartman (4th-prc-vet-Harrisburg), was crowned Miss Agriculture for 1962 Saturday night at the 13th annual Ag Hill party in Recreation Building.

Miss Hartman, who won the crown over four other finalists, was sponsored by the Delta Theta Sigma fraternity.

The party began with a buffet-style ham dinner followed by the presentation of fall term awards and scholarships. Another event of the evening included round and square dancing with music by Jay Cruis and the Country Gentlemen.

COSTUMES, decorations, and relics from the early history of Ag Hill carried out the "Way back when..." theme of the party, commemorating 100 years of agricultural progress since the signing of the Morrill Act in 1862 creating land-grant universities.

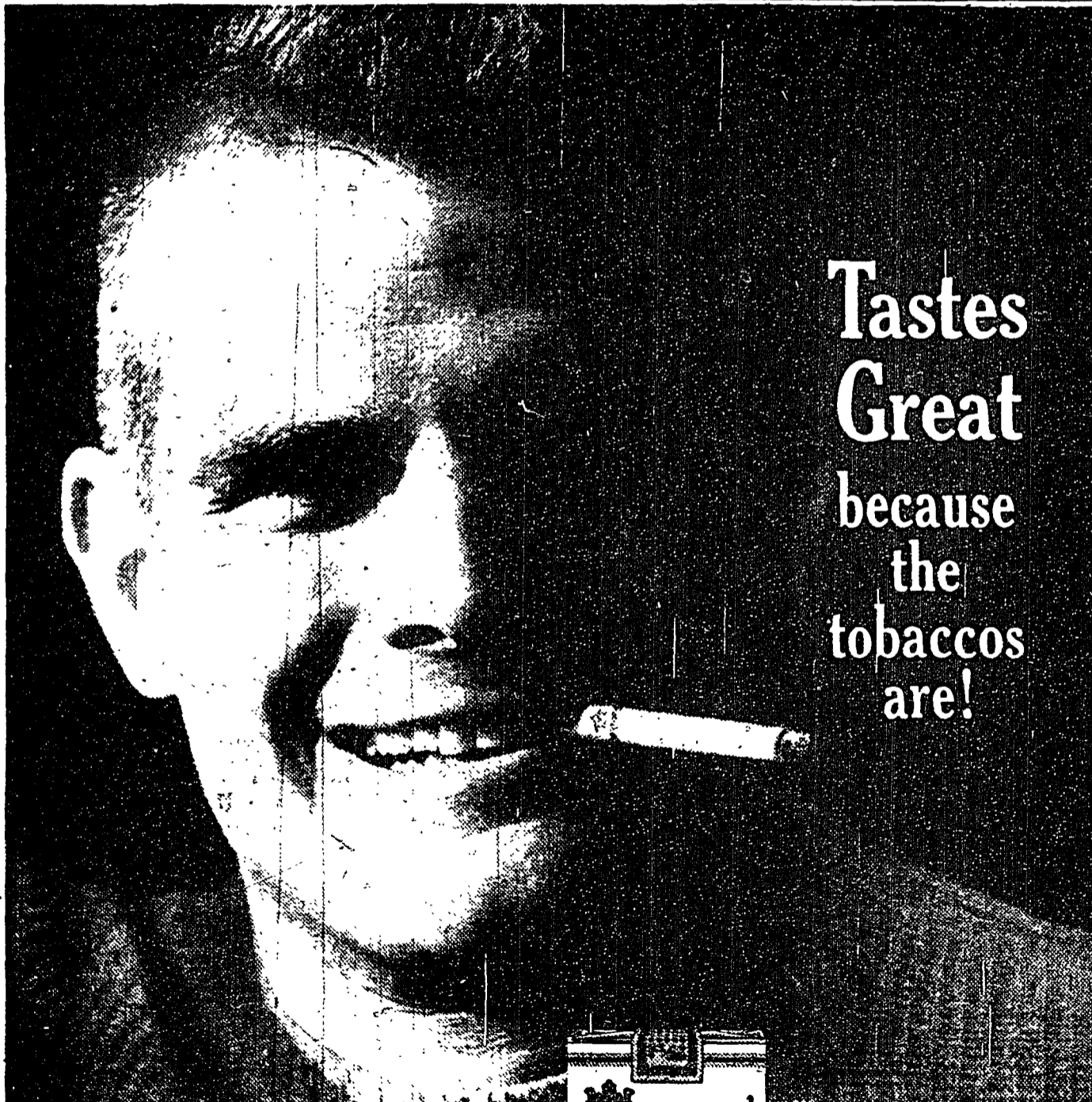

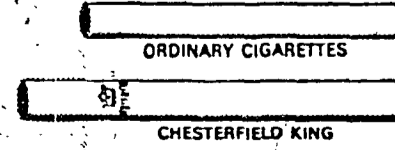
