

# Subcommittee Disciplines Five

The Senate Subcommittee on Discipline yesterday placed three male students on deferred suspension, one on suspended suspension, and placed a disciplinary hold on the record of a fifth student, Daniel R. Leasure, assistant dean of men, said yesterday.

Leasure said a fourth term student in the Division of Counseling and a fourth term student in Business Administration were placed on deferred suspension until the end of this term, and then suspended until the end of the winter term, 1963.

Deferred suspension means that actual suspension of the student, will not begin until the winter term, 1963.

THE MEN had women in their trailer on Saturday, Nov. 10, 1962, Leasure said.

These women were non-students who were the guests of a University coed, Leasure said. He said the coed arranged with these men for her friends' overnight lodging in the trailer.

A fifth term student in Business Administration, involved in transporting the girls to the trailer, was placed on suspended sus-

pension until the end of the winter term, 1963, Leasure said.

Suspended suspension gives the dean of men authority to suspend a student for additional misconduct without consulting the Senate Subcommittee on Discipline.

IN OTHER action, Leasure said a 12th term student in psychology was placed on deferred suspension until the end of this term and on suspension until the end of the winter term, 1963, for entertaining a coed in his private living quarters.

In another case, a disciplinary hold was placed on the record of a student who entertained a coed in his apartment while on suspension. The student was living downtown and not enrolled in school at the time of the incident because of his suspension.

With this hold on his record, the student cannot be relieved of

his suspension and readmitted to the University until investigation of the incident is complete.

THE THREE University women involved in these incidents have been placed on suspension, Mrs. Jane Leiper, assistant dean of women, said yesterday.

She said two of the women, a tenth term student in the College of Education and a tenth term student in the College of Liberal Arts, were suspended until the end of the spring term, 1963.

The other woman was suspended until the end of this term, she added.

# Panhel Permits Thetas To Hold 3 Additional Rounds in Rush

Possible topics for the workshop discussion groups were suggested by Judith Walko, workshop chairman. They include the history and future of sororities at Penn State, responsibilities of sorority women, etiquette, rush and scholarship.
