

Soviet Power Struggles Continue, Turner Says

The decentralization of the Soviet secret police, the revision of the Russian legal code, and the critical voices of Russian artists and writers should not obscure the fact that the power struggle in the Soviet Union has not been affected, John E. Turner, professor of Political Science at the University of Minnesota, said last night.

Turner spoke on "Superlative Glances into Soviet Future" at the invitation of the political science department and the Russian Area committee.

Turner said that in 1955, two years after Joseph Stalin's death, the then Soviet Premier Georgi Malenkov was forced to publicly denounce himself as being "anti-Party" by Nikita Khrushchev and Nikolai Bulganin, who practiced "collective leadership" until Bulganin was ousted.

IN 1956, Khrushchev denounced Stalin, who was almost a god in the eyes of the Soviet people, Turner said. Khrushchev could do so with relatively little fear of condemnation because he had decentralized and isolated the power bloc agencies which would have protested, the political science professor said.

Khrushchev had done this by

firing the head of the secret police from the Politburo, reshuffling the state bureaucracy and dispersing the heads of its large economic ministries and dismissing Marshal Zhukov, of the Red Army, Turner said.

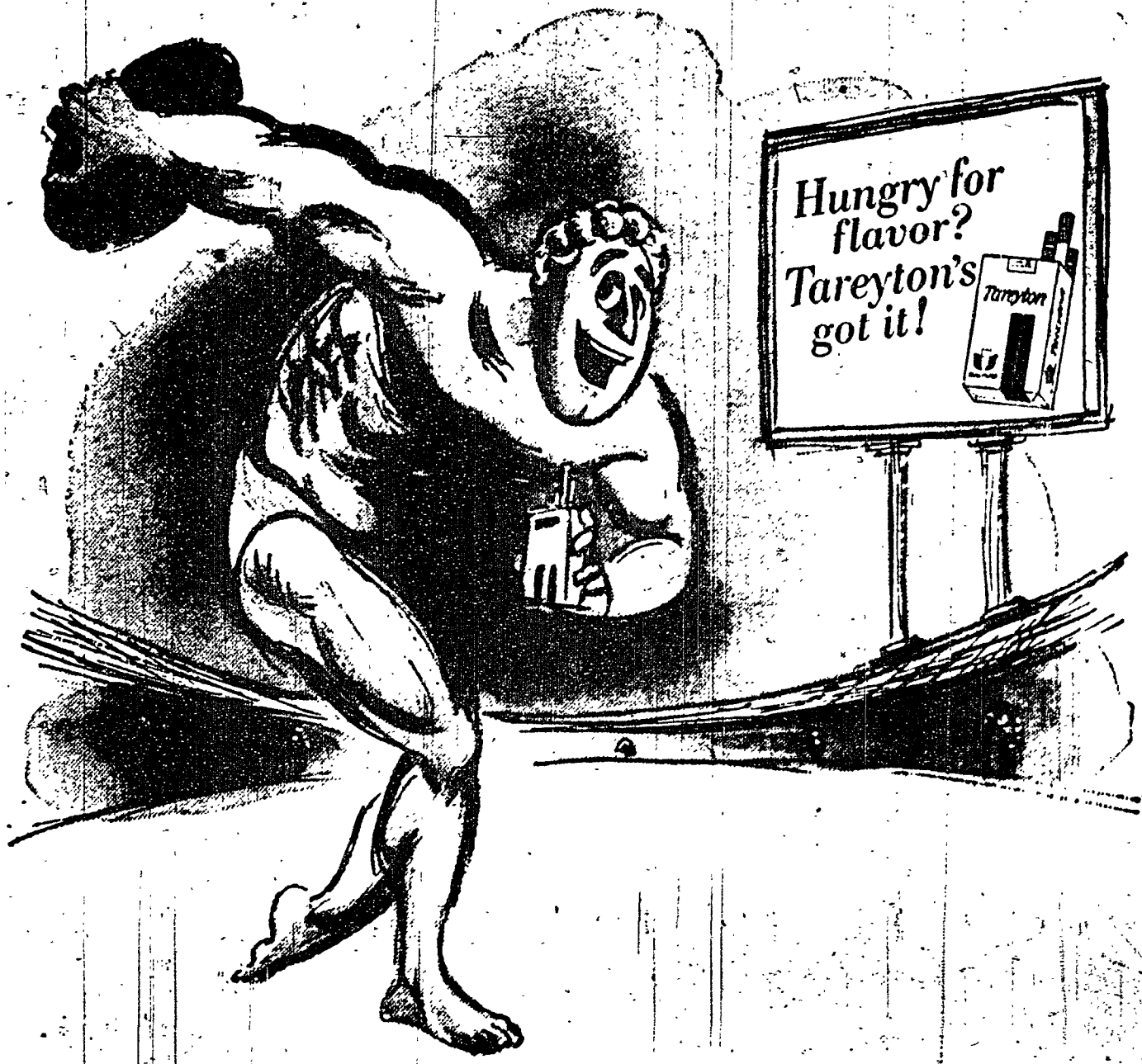
