

Pirates Trade Stuart, Lamabe

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Inter-league trading opened with a bang yesterday as the Pittsburgh Pirates and the Boston Red Sox announced a swap of four frontline players that appeared on the surface to satisfy all concerned.

In a deal that Pirate General Manager Joe L. Brown said "was fairly well consummated some time back," the Pirates sent slugging first baseman Dick Stuart and relief pitcher Jack Lamabe to the Red Sox for starting hurler Don Schwall and catcher Jim Pagliaroni.

It was the second major trade announced by the Pirates in less than 48 hours.

On Monday, Pittsburgh traded all-star shortstop Dick Groat and aging relief pitcher Diomedes Olivo to St. Louis for starting pitcher Don Cardwell and infielder Julio Gotay.

"I feel the Pirates are getting a good young catcher and a fine pitcher," Brown told newsmen.

"I don't think either man has reached his potential yet. And, I think we are now in a better position to win the pennant."

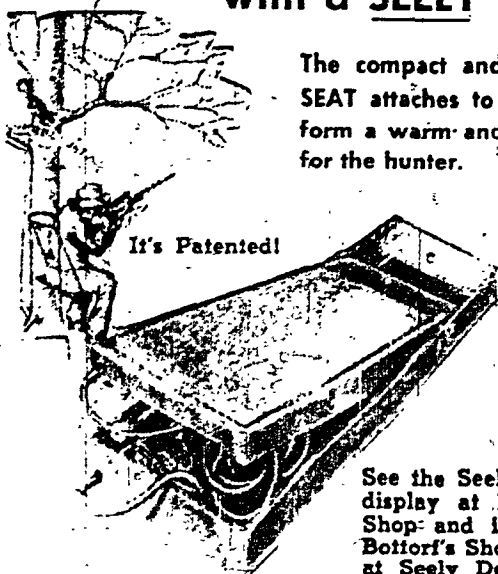
