

Thant Meets U.S. Representatives To Discuss Cuban Developments

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — Top U.S. negotiators met with Acting Secretary-General U Thant yesterday as the United States reacted coldly to Fidel Castro's proposal for U.N. inspection of military bases both inside and outside Cuba.

U.S. Ambassador Adlai E. Stevenson, special Cuban advisor John J. McCloy and U.S. Ambassador Charles W. Yost called on Thant to give him the latest U.S. assessment on Cuban developments.

Informed sources said that the United States has told Thant that it cannot accept Castro's demands as contained in a Soviet-Cuban proposal relayed by the secretary-general last week.

These include a request for U.S.-Cuban negotiations on withdrawal of the United States from its naval base at Guantanamo and an end to U.S. economic pressures against Cuba.

THE INFORMANTS said that attempts are being made to set the stage for a meeting of the U.N. Security Council — possibly this week — on the Cuban situation.

Its purpose would be to close out the current phase of the crisis. This would be done either by individual summations of the situation by the United States,

the Soviet Union and Cuba, or perhaps a joint U.S.-Soviet statement noting removal of Soviet missiles, the promise to remove Soviet jet bombers and the end of the U.S. naval quarantine of Cuba.

SHORTLY BEFORE Soviet First Deputy Premier Anastas I. Mikoyan left Havana after a 24-day stay, the Castro government issued a statement in which Cuba offered to permit inspection of Soviet withdrawal of offensive weapons, provided the United Nations confirms dismantling of bases Castro alleges are being set up outside Cuba by counterrevolutionaries.

Castro mentioned Puerto Rico and other sites as alleged centers of activity aimed at toppling his regime.

Taylor Reelected

HARRISBURG (AP) — Senate Republicans returned M. Harvey Taylor to the key position of senate president pro tempore yesterday.

Taylor, 86, was endorsed by the GOP caucus without opposition after a motion to put the vote for the pro tem's job to secret ballot was beaten, 14-10.

Taylor, of Harrisburg, reaffirmed his support of Gov.-elect William W. Scranton's legislative program.

Negro Applies in Ala.

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. (AP) — A Negro coed at Alabama A&M, Vivian Malone, 20, confirmed yesterday that she had applied for admission to the white University of Alabama.

Miss Malone of Mobile said she mailed an application to the university in Tuscaloosa last Wednesday.

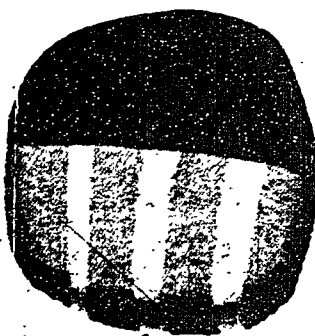
"I haven't had a reply," she said during a telephone interview.

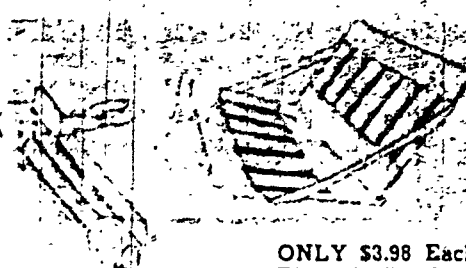

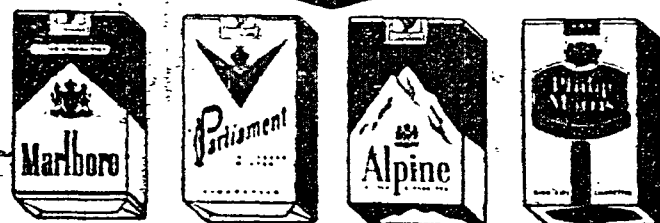
