(Continued from page one) therefore, been attempting to meet some of the needs for students activity facilities with modified student union areas, such as snack bars, lounges and game rooms in the various residence hall areas, Campbell said.

Because of costs, the present building, completed in 1955 when campus enrollment was 12,000, was reduced in size from the

original plans even before construction was started. The building was, however, designed to facilitate later additions.

WITH THE planned addition the building should equal the original plans in terms of financial aspects and size. Walter H. Wiegand, director of the physical plant, said yesterday. It will not,

however, include all of the originally planned facilities, he said.

The original building was planned first by a committee which toured many other campuses with student union buildings. They then made recommendations for a student union building to meet the needs of the Penn State students, Wiegand said.

### Student's Slayers Held in Georgia

The confessed slayers of Nicholas Matthew Cascario (4th-electrical and electronics technology-Bangor) were transferred Wednesday from the Baxley, Ga., jail where they were being held. They were taken by sheriffs to Waycross, Ga., 50 miles from Baxley.

The sheriffs feared violence from the "deeply aroused" townspeople toward Wilton Edwards, 39, and his nephew Robert Edwards, 19, both of Baxley.

Both men confessed to the slaying which occurred last Saturday

evening, but said they acted in self-defense after Cascario tried to run them off U.S. Route 1 North, where they were traveling.

Sheriff J. B. Carter of Baxley said earlier that the two had been harassing Cascario by racing ahead of and then dropping behind him. Carter said they had pushed Cascario off the road and killed him when he came back to their car to protest.

Cascario would have graduated in June from the Commonwealth campus at Allentown in the two-year associate degree program.

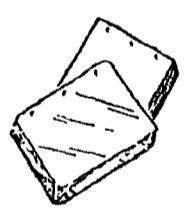

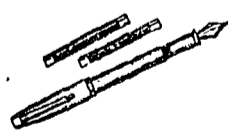
