

# Bartlett To Speak On Audacious Belief

Gene E. Bartlett, president of Colgate Rochester Divinity School, Rochester, N.Y., will speak on "Our Most Audacious Belief" at the 10:55 a.m. Chapel service tomorrow in Schwab.

Dr. Bartlett has lectured at Vanderbilt University, Andover Newton Theological School, Yale University, St. Steven's College, Canada, and Garrett Biblical Institute, Evanston, Ill. He also had a radio ministry with regular broadcasts from 1935 to 1960.

Willa Taylor will direct the Chapel Choir in Thomas Tomkins' "My Shepherd is the Living Lord," edited by Denis Stevens, distinguished visiting professor of music.

The Penn State Camera Club will work on a collection of photographs illustrating life at Penn State. Club members are being asked to take pictures that will illustrate all aspects of life on campus.

This will include classes, study, athletic and social events. The club expects that it will eventually be possible to compile a set of pictures which tells the University story. This idea was inspired by Edward Steichen's famous collection, "The Family of Man."

"If the collection should prove successful it will be available for display at the Hetzel Union Building and other centers throughout the state," Peter H. Given, professor of fuel technology, said. "It could be used to increase understanding of University life and could be exchanged with similar collections from other universities in this country and abroad."
