

## Robinson Drops Out Until Spring Term

Dave Robinson, Penn State's All-American end, has dropped out of school for the winter term. He will, however, return in the spring.

After four months of football, Robinson said he "needed a rest." He is also scheduled to appear at a large number of banquets which would prevent him from giving

proper time to his studies.

Presently enrolled in the College of Business Administration, Robinson intends to return to the engineering curriculum next term. He dropped engineering last spring because of scholastic difficulties.

The consensus All-American signed a professional contract with the Green Bay Packers and said he will report to the National League camp during the summer unless he is recommended for the College All-Star game in Chicago.
