

Violinist To Perform In Schwab Thursday

Violinist Ruggiero Ricci, acknowledged as a child prodigy by The New York Times when he gave his first public performance at the age of nine, will appear at 8:30 Thursday night in Schwab.

THE CONCERT is sponsored by the University Artists Series. Student ticket distribution will continue today through Thursday from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 5 p.m. at the Hetzel Union desk. General sale of tickets to the public for \$1.50 each will be held at the same time.

Ricci's father, a trombonist and bandmaster, exposed his son to music from his infancy. Louis Persinger, internationally known for stringed instrument instruc-

tion, accepted Ricci as a student at the age of five.

At his first New York concert, given in 1929, Ricci played the Mendelssohn Violin Concerto with the Manhattan Symphony Orchestra. The late Olin Downes of The New York Times wrote of this performance, "He is a born virtuoso and more, a true 'wunderkind.' All that the great violinists do, he did."

Ricci has been welcomed by many foreign governments, including Russia. The Russian government gave him an official invitation to give 12 concerts under its auspices in five leading cities in 1961.

HIS DEBUT in Moscow won a standing ovation from the audience which obliged him to play nine encores. "Ruggiero Ricci would probably still be playing, in fact," a wire news service reported, "if a string on his violin hadn't snapped!"

Ricci will not play this concert without accompaniment, as he has usually done. Leon Pommers will join him, playing the piano.

The two will play Sonata in G Major by Nicola Porpora; Sonata in A Major, Opus 47, by Beethoven; Serge Prokofiev's Sonata in D Major, Opus 94; and Tzigune by Maurice Ravel.
