

Illinois Prof To Give First Genetics Lecture

The first in a series of lectures, sponsored by the Department of Psychology will be given at 8 tonight in 100 Chambers.

Jerry Hirsch, professor of psychology at the University of Illinois, will speak on "The Impact of

the New Biology on the Study of Behavior."

Behavioral research will be the topic of the second lecture by G. E. McClearn, associate professor of psychology at the University of California, at Berkley.

The third lecture will deal with

genetics and behavior. It will be given by John Fuller at the R. B. Jackson Memorial Laboratory.

The last lecture will be given by Benson Ginsburg, professor at the University of Chicago. His topic will be autogenic behaviors (seizures) in mice.

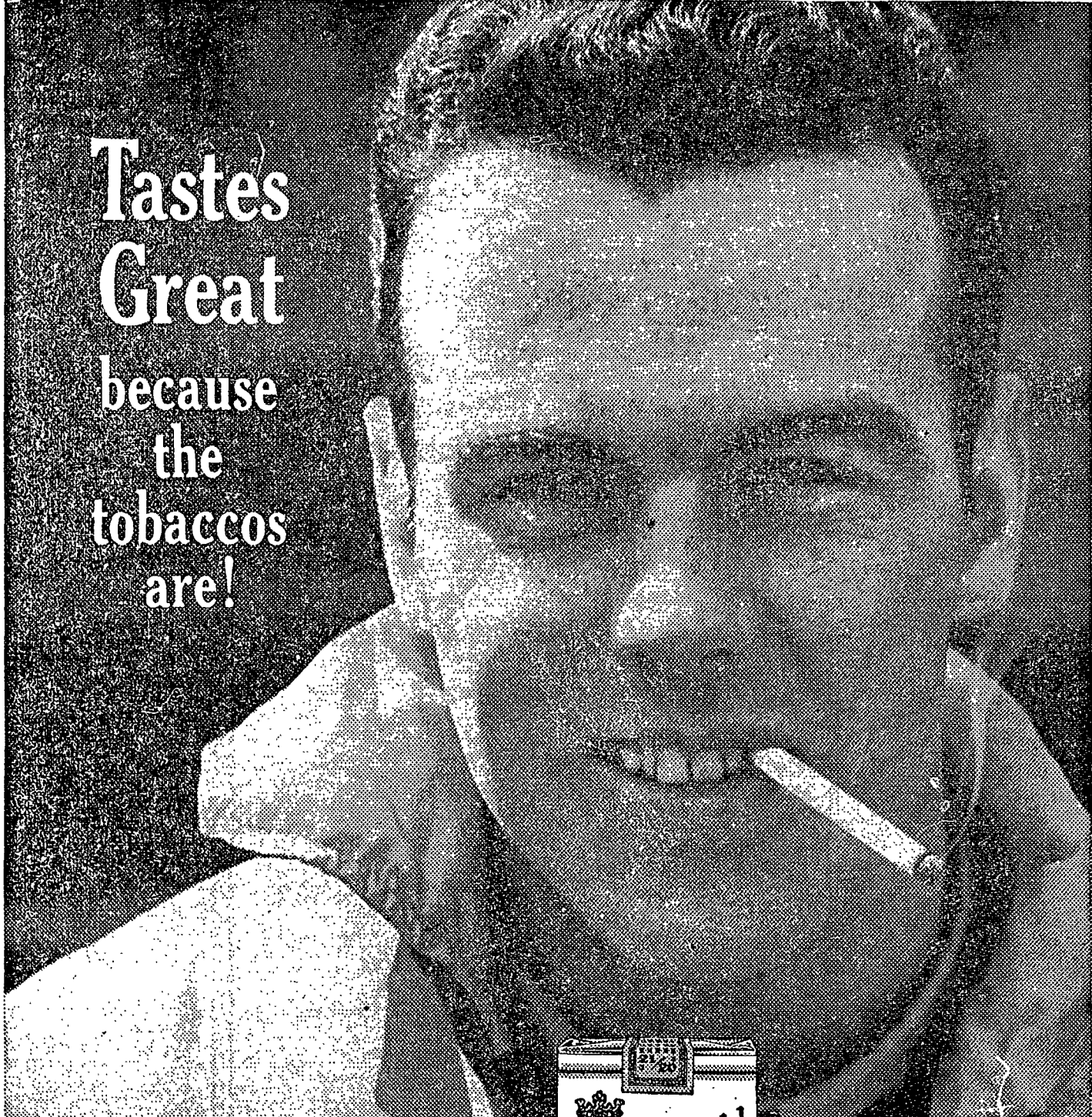
