

Broadcast Agreement Renewed

An agreement on the production of educational television programs by the University for broadcasting on a commercial Altoona station has been renewed for five years.

Altoona station, WFBG-TV, has agreed to air a minimum of three hours a week of University programs.

Triangle publications, Inc., the third party in the agreement, will provide the University with a \$10,000 grant to finance the costs of production.

For several years under the previous agreement, the TV programming produced by the University and aired on the station has exceeded the required minimum.

A second micro-wave from the WFBG-TV station to the Altoona campus of the University will also be established. In the fall term

1962, a micro-wave link for closed-circuit television was constructed between the University and the Altoona campus.

Several closed circuit classes offered on the main campus have since been relayed to students in Altoona.
