

Job Interviews To Continue Until May

Employment interviews for March, June and August graduates have begun and will continue through the end of April, Robert G. Schnelle, assistant director of the University Placement Service, said recently.

About 400 companies will have representatives on campus during the current interview period, which began Jan. 21.

Appointments for interviews

can be made at the office of the placement service, 128 Temporary.

A complete list of job openings is maintained on a bulletin board outside the placement service's office, and a list of companies which will be conducting interviews is located inside the office.

Interviews are being conducted in Temporary, the Hetzel Union Building and Burrowes. Schnelle

advised students to make special note of the location of their interview.

He also asked that students make appointments for interviews about two weeks in advance of the date they desire. This will enable the service to inform the companies when a heavy schedule is being prepared, so that additional personnel can be scheduled to conduct interviews.
