

# Warm Weather Hits Campus

The warmest weather in three and a half weeks was observed yesterday afternoon as the mercury reached 47 degrees. Similar readings are expected today, but a return to colder weather is forecast for tomorrow. A general warming trend was noted in the northeastern states yesterday and the abnormally warm weather of Monday also continued in the central states. The mercury touched 60 in the Dakotas and the 70's in Kansas. Today should be partly cloudy and mild with increasing cloudiness in the afternoon. A high of 46 degrees is likely.

Cloudy skies and occasional rain are indicated for tonight. The low will be about 35. Snow flurries and colder weather are seen for tomorrow.

(Continued from page one) up. The chair ruled that this provision changed the meaning of the bill and therefore the entire proposal had to return to the Rules Committee. The amendment will be read and discussed for the first time tonight. The USG constitution may only be amended by two-thirds vote of Congress, after being presented and read at three consecutive meetings. The last bill, an elections code revision, calls for the area council

to break a tie occurring between two candidates. This bill also appeared on last week's agenda but Geiger withdrew it because he said that he wanted to present all elections revisions at the same time.

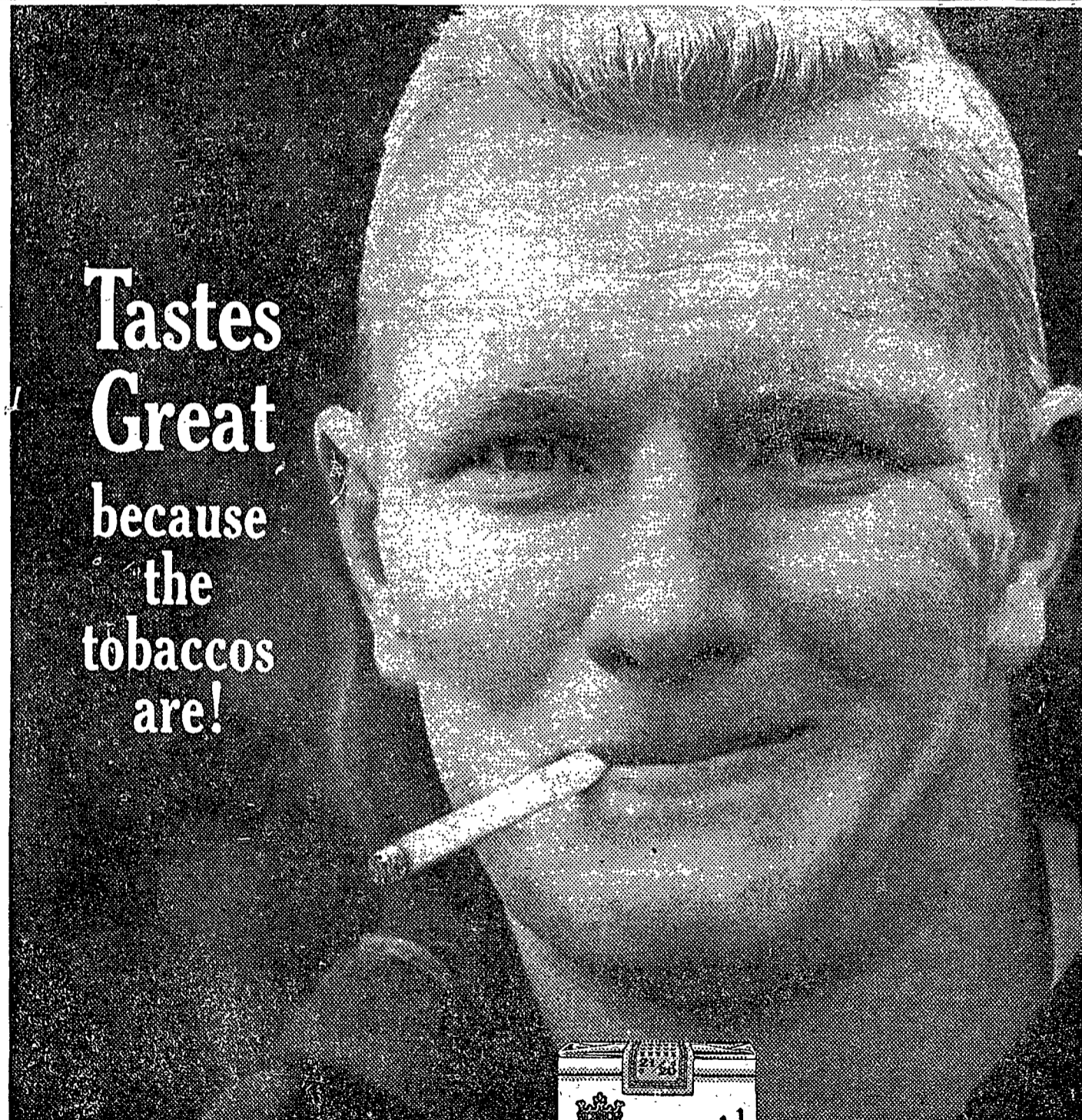

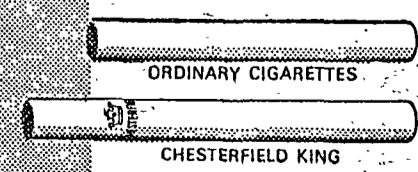
