

# Jewish-Christian Service To Stress Brotherhood

The Rev. P. Barrett Rudd, acting director of the University Christian Association, and Rabbi Norman T. Goldberg, director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation, will participate in the Eighth Annual Jewish-Christian Service at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab.

The Rev. Mr. Rudd will be the speaker at the service, which marks the beginning of Brother-

hood Week, designed to promote better inter-faith relations. His topic will be "Who Are My Brothers?"

Willa Taylor will direct the Chapel Choir in Miriam Gideon's "How Goodly Are Thy Tent" and the first stanza of "En Keloheinu." The congregation will join in singing the Hebrew text of the hymn following the choir's performance.

Leonard Raver, chapel organist, will play "Kol Nidre" by Felix Berinski, Bach's Chorale Prelude on "Lobe den Herren" and Toccata on Leoni by Seth Bingham.

THE REV. Richard Nutt, director of the Wesley Foundation, will be the speaker at the 9 a.m. service tomorrow in Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel. His topic will be "A Faithful Steward of Christ."

Lee VanBremen, seminary intern with the University Christian Association, will lead the service.

James W. Beach will direct the Meditation Chapel Choir in "My Shepard Will Supply My Need" by Virgil Thompson. Janet Kerr (8th - home economics - Nazareth) will be organist.

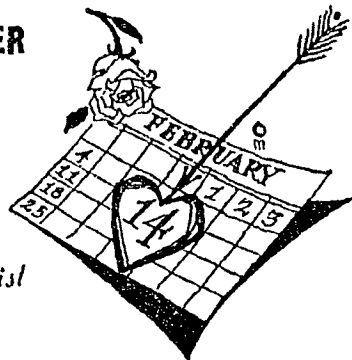
