

Campus Craze Sets Student Spinning

A University student has claimed the national record in the latest campus craze by "spinning" for 45 minutes in an automatic clothes dryer.

Christopher Schultz (2nd-engineering-Springfield) earned his niche in the hall of fame when he "ran his circles" while enclosed inside an automatic clothes dryer in East Halls last weekend.

The flexible Schultz, who stands 5'7" and weighs 125 pounds, said he actually completed 2,277 such circles to set the unofficial record in the nation's latest "extracurricular" collegiate pastime.

Schultz's sterling performance

topped the previous mark of 1,214 turns, set by an unidentified student at Montana State University, according to the National Broadcasting Corporation radio network.

The intrepid "whirling dervish" of the University said participation in the sport is not as difficult as it appears.

HE SAID HE padded the interior of the dryer with pillows to cushion the jostles, jolts and bumps that are occupational hazards for "spinners."

Friends assisted Schultz by holding the dryer door open throughout his ordeal to prevent suffocation and by periodically inserting coins into the machine slot to keep it running.

After forty-five minutes a nauseated, but ecstatic victor

emerged from the dryer as the unofficial national champion of intercollegiate spinners.

SCHULTZ SAID, however, that he would not attempt the feat again, even if another student erased his record. He said he preferred to "rest on his laurels," ephemeral as they may be.

Some observers said they feared the new "sport," which they termed "frivolous," would encroach upon the popularity of more sedate, standard pastimes such as telephone booth stuffing.

Known for her recordings as well as for her stage appearances, Miss Curtin, whom Time maga-

zine featured in an article last fall, has recorded "St. John's Passion" and Beethoven's "Ninth Symphony." More recently she has recorded with Eugene Ormandy and the Philadelphia Orchestra.

ON TELEVISION in this country, Miss Curtin has been seen on the "Telephone Hour" and as Fiora in "Love of Three Kings," presented by the NBC-TV Opera. She has also appeared on ABC in a musical special and in Europe has starred on her own program.

Miss Curtin will include selections from various musical periods in the program on Saturday.
