

# Lions Crippled for Pitt Harriers Fail To Qualify for NCAA's

A popular hangout for most Penn State football players these days is the training room. The crippled and battered Lions, who face Pitt in an important grid battle Saturday in Pittsburgh, added four more names to the treatment list after yesterday's practice.

Fullbacks Ed Stuckrath and Dave McNaughton and tackles John Deibert and John Simko all required attention of some sort after drills in which the Lions sharpened their offensive blocking.

"We can't even keep our boys from getting hurt in practices," Rip Engle said after the workout in which the Nittanies stressed their running game. "It has been one thing after another."

Tackles Harrison Rosdahl, Terry Monaghan and Gary Eberle are already scratched for the contest and there is a good chance that tackle Joe Bellas will see only limited action.

This will mean that Engle will be forced to go with Sandy Buchan, Simko, Deibert, Joe Vierzbicki and Don Steinbacher at tackles. And of the group, not one has had a vast amount of varsity game experience.

Simko and Buchan were used sparingly last year while Vierzbicki and Steinbacher are sophomores. Deibert, who still is on the doubtful list, started playing regularly midway through the season after injuries depleted the corps.

"You have to hand it to these boys," Engle said pointing to his tackles. "They have stepped in there and have done a wonderful job. I'm real proud of them."

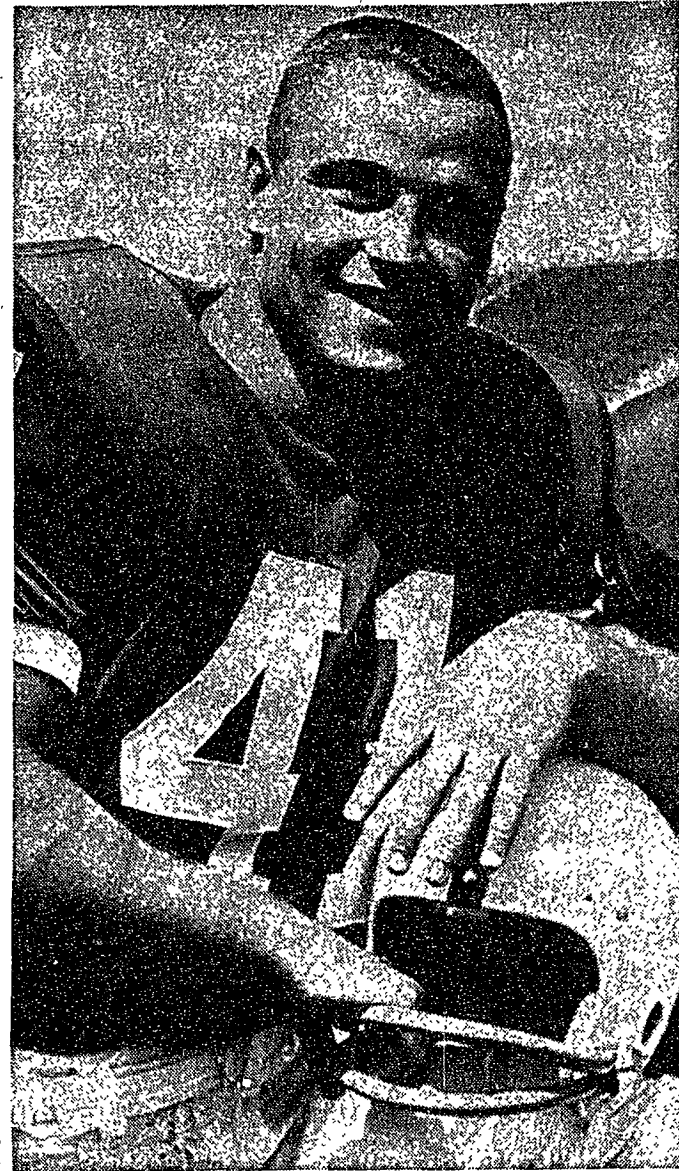

Coach John Lucas said he was naturally quite disappointed that the team will be unable to go but the agreement is a fair one.

"With the event getting bigger and bigger each year we need more restrictions," Lucas said. "After all, it is the championships and this is supposed to mean that the finest individuals and teams in the country participate."

The Nittany coach said the boys didn't quite understand about the ruling and were also disappointed. "We will just have to set our goals to finish in the top five next year," Lucas said. "This will be a good incentive."

In other cross country news, the newly formed Nittany Lion Track and Field Club placed first in the Western Pennsylvania Cross-Country Championships held last Saturday at Grove City.

The local squad beat teams from Slippery Rock, Grove City and Thiel Colleges. Eleven harriers made the trip.

A 26-year-old Doctoral candidate from Pitt, Mike Foulds

won the individual title while Steve Gentry, the amazing State College High School junior finished second.
