British Optimistic

Attitudes Differ Concerning British Buses-for-Cuba Deal

LONDON (AP) — British officials forecast yesterday that Britain's relations with the United States will emerge intact from the tempest stirred up by the \$11.1-million British buses-for-Cuba deal.

That attitude was not wholly shared on the other side of the Atlantic. Former President Harry S. Truman, for instance, told newsmen in New York that the deal had not shown the attitude of a very good friend in connection with the sale by the Leyland Motor Corp.

Commenting on the sale at a news conference in Washington, State Department press officer Robert McCloskey said, "It certainly does not help our efforts to isolate the Cuban regime and thereby weaken its economy."

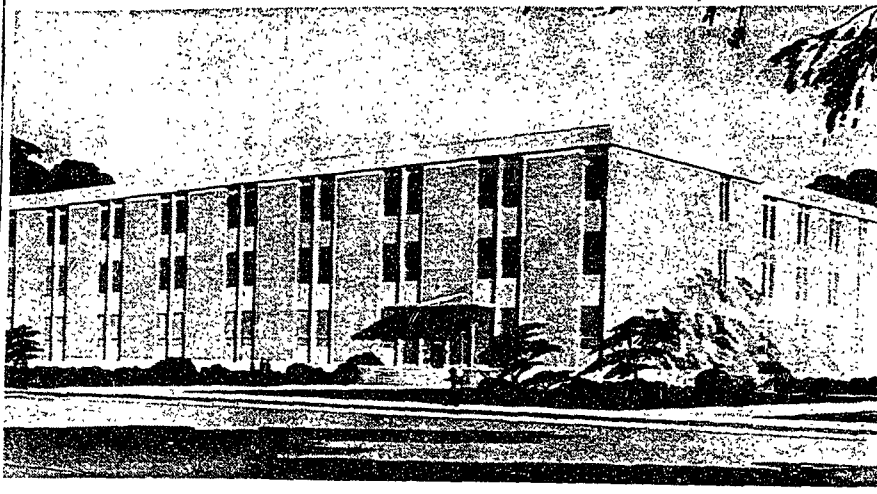

Business Expects Onslaught Of Higher Wage Demands

NEW YORK—Management is getting set for higher wage demands this year. The emphasis last year turned to job security. Before that fringe benefits added to total labor costs at a faster rate than did the increase in wages and salaries.

Job security is still a prime concern in many labor contracts up for negotiation this year and a worry to countless other workers. And the scope and cost of fringe benefits also is sure to grow.

Higher Wage Scales
But union leaders have been saying the impressive profit gains of 1963 should be the basis in 1964 for more liberal wage scales as well as for higher dividends.

of total payments for employees will be upward. And the increase in the past five years has been impressive.

Shorter work weeks and increased overtime pay scales are being demanded as another phase of job security.

Other Objectives
Scranton said other objectives for the coming year would include: "Concentration on improving the administrative machinery of the state government."
