Campbell Speaks At AWS Meeting; Explains Duties

A talk by Stanley H. Campbell, vice president for business at the University, highlighted the second meeting of the Association of Women Students' Senate, last night.

Among other things Campbell spoke concerning his duties in connection with food services, housing, security and the future plans for the University.

He commented that a shuttle bus system for the campus is not being considered at the present time.

The question of whether the University should provide bus transportation to and from the various extremities of campus has arisen in recent years due to Penn State's tremendous growth.

Juliet Cromite, AWS president said that Campbell's appearance before the group after regular working hours showed that administrative officials have a true concern for students.

The group also discussed the sending of delegates to the sub-regional convention of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Women Students.

The convention is to be held at Syracuse, New York, Nov. 21-22.

It was also announced that applications for the editorship of the AWS publication the "Penn State Women" are available at the Hetzel Union desk and must be returned by Nov. 9.

Business Cycle Climbs

Improvement in business profits and the 1964 tax reduction are the factors credited with sustaining the current business cycle's upward climb, according to David McKinley, professor of banking and associate dean of the College of Business Administration.

It has been 44 months since the last trough in the cycle, which makes this business advance longer than any previous peacetime expansion in the past 100 years.

McKinley predicts the turning point may come in the second quarter of 1965. Many observers foresee a continued rise of the Gross National Product during the next six months but express some doubts as to the second half of the coming year.

\$630 Billion

The GNP is now close to the \$630 billion annual rate as compared with \$501 billions in the first quarter of 1961, when the last turning point came.

McKinley said the tax reduction was importantly causative of the improvement in business profits, although the improvement came also from reduced labor costs in 1962, 1963 and the first part of 1964.

"Whether the crest of the present business cycle actually occurs in 1965 may depend upon the balance of two forces: further reduction of taxes scheduled for 1965 versus the now expected reversal in unit labor costs," McKinley said.

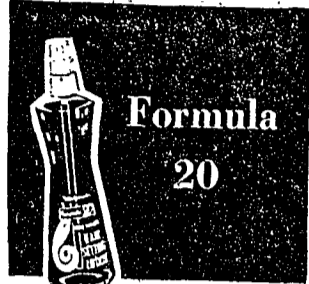

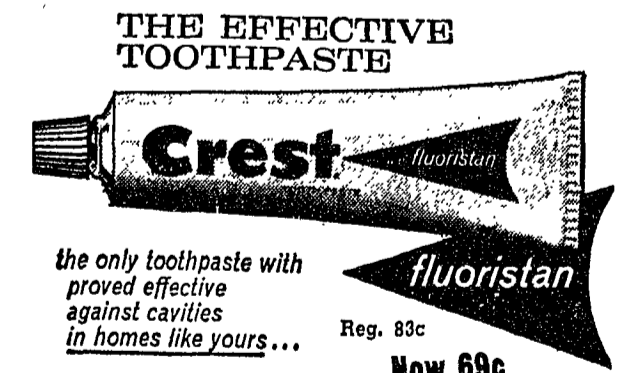

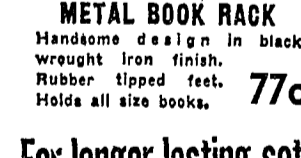
