Medicare scheme because it would provide only partial coverage of hospital bills while overburdening Social Security taxes.

Finally, the GOP standard-bearer predicted that a large political upset is in the making, and he urged the election of local Republican candidates.

Chance Next Tuesday
He concluded by saying: "Next Tuesday you can have your country back."

Following his speech, Goldwater took time for some hand-shaking and autograph signing before he and his wife boarded the train again.

Included in the University's delegation at Lewistown were students Michael Lavin of the Young Americans for Freedom, and John Glise, chairman of the Young Americans for Goldwater-Miller, which coordinates events of this nature.

Glise said he was "impressed" with Goldwater's appearance and speech. "Some people might say he was wrong in bringing up the Social Security matter in a depressed area like this, where many of the people depend on Social Security," Lavin said, "but that's the way Sen. Goldwater is."

Glise said that he particularly noted the speech and rally were conducted in a "more serious tone than usual," with more "policy talk."

"He was trying to set the record straight," Glise said, "and trying to convince people that he is in favor of Social Security." He also observed that the candidate appeared "more somber" than he had in past occasions.

The Republican candidate's Lewistown visit was the first he had made in this area since he spoke at the University in 1962. He is the only major candidate to appear near State College in this campaign.

Universional Organizational Structure Termed 'Unique'

Penn State is unique. There is no other school in the country which is governed like it or has the same kind of relations with the state government.

Despite its land-grant status, Penn State is not controlled by the state and enjoys freedom from practically all budget control. In fact, the University assumes many of its own responsibilities. One example of this is in its residence hall construction financing.

Penn State has a 32-member board of trustees who "run" the University.

Governing Board
The governing board consists of six men appointed by the governor with Senate confirmation, nine elected by the alumni, six elected by county agricultural societies, and six elected by county business and industrial societies.

The remaining five positions are ex-officio offices held by

the governor, the superintendent of public instruction, the secretary of agriculture, the secretary of mines and the university president.

The entire board meets twice a year, with an 11-member executive board meeting seven times a year.

The elective and appointed offices are all three-year terms. Those members appointed by the governor for a three-year term of office serve until a successor is appointed and confirmed by the Senate.

March Election
Alumni representatives are selected through a nominating ballot sent out each March. The names of those who receive fifty or more votes and agree to run for the position are then placed on a voting ballot which is mailed in May.

Because of sheer numbers and lack of interest on the part of most alumni, ballots are sent only to members of the Alumni Association and to those alumni who have contributed to the alumni fund. Nevertheless, anyone who is an alumnus of three or more years is eligible to vote and will be sent a ballot upon request.

According to Wilmer E. Kenworthy, executive assistant to President Walker, only about six or seven thousand persons participate in this alumni election of board members.

Annual Convention
Representatives from the county societies are elected at a convention held here each June. Invitations are sent to members of all such industrial and agricultural organizations in the state.

Each county, however, receives only three votes for the agricultural representative and three votes for the business representative.

Nominations are made from the floor through nominating and seconding speeches.

The board of trustees has nine standing committees which meet twice annually and at other times when necessary. They include physical plant committee, finance, instruction, student affairs, research, commonwealth cam-

Prospective Teacher Tests Scheduled for December

College seniors who are preparing to teach school may take the National Teacher Examinations on Dec. 12 at the State College Area Senior High School Building. The tests will also be given on March 20, July 17, and Oct. 2 at 550 locations throughout the country.

Many school systems use the scores of these tests for employment of new teachers. Lists of these schools are available at the University. The prospective teacher should take two tests. The Common Examinations test measure the general preparation of the teacher. One of 13 Teaching Area Examinations measure mastery of the subject they expect to teach.

Students may learn which tests they should take and on which dates they should be taken by contacting the school system in which they are seeking employment. A Bulletin of Information with registration forms, lists of test centers, and information about the tests is available at college placement offices, and departments training teachers. Students may also contact the National Teacher Examinations, Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey.

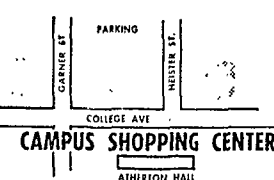

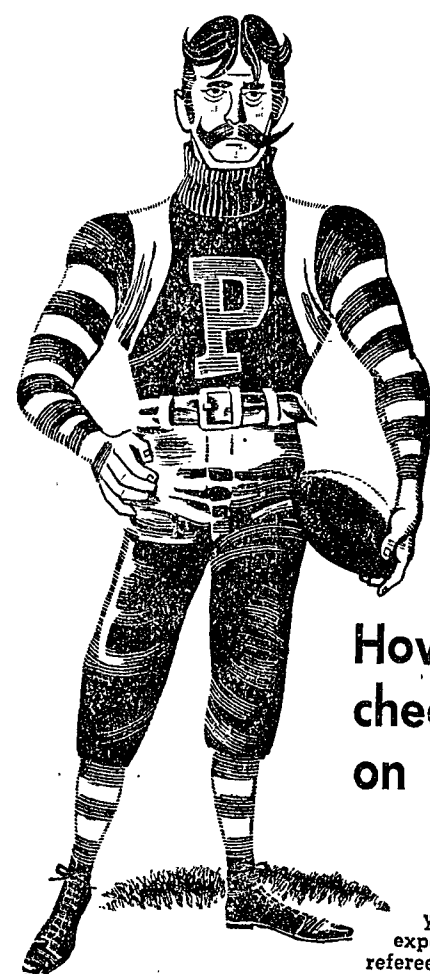
