

Fawcett To Lecture In Biological Series

Donald W. Fawcett, Hershey professor of anatomy and head of the department of anatomy at Harvard Medical School, will speak at 4:00 p.m. today in 310 Whitmore as guest lecturer in the Biological Lecture Series.

The cell biologist and electron microscopist will speak on "The Structure and Function of the Membrane Systems of the Cytoplasm."

After receiving his medical degree from Harvard Medical School, Fawcett taught at Cornell Medical School as professor of anatomy and chairman of the department of anatomy.

Fawcett has served nationally as a member of the Cell Physiology Panel of the Committee on Growth in the National Research Council. He was also a consultant to the United States Public Health Service, Morphology and Genetics Study Sections and the Cell Biology Study Section, Division of Research Grants of

the National Institutes of Health.

The biologist has been a member of the U.S. Public Health Service Anatomical Sciences Training Committee and has served as a member of the Board of Editors of the Journal of Lipid Research and the Journal of Biological and Biochemical Cytology.

In addition, the noted biologist is active as a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He is a member and past vice president of the American Association of Anatomists and of the Tissue Culture Association.

Fawcett was the first president of the American Society for Cell Biology. Currently he is a director of the Electron Microscope Society of America. He is also a member of the Histochemical Society, the New York Academy of Science, the Society for Experimental Biology and Medicine, and the Society for the Study of Development and Growth of International Cell Biology.

These cadets in both services are eligible to apply for commissions in the regular Army and Air Force.

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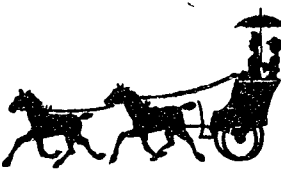
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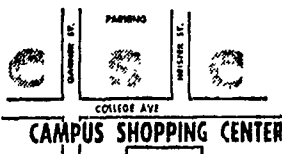
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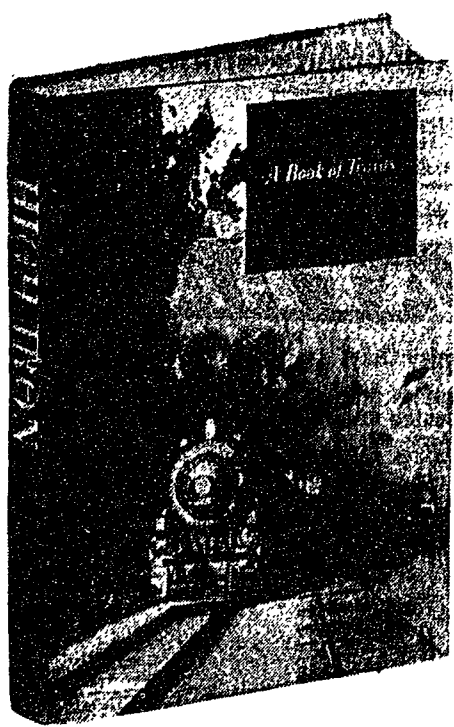


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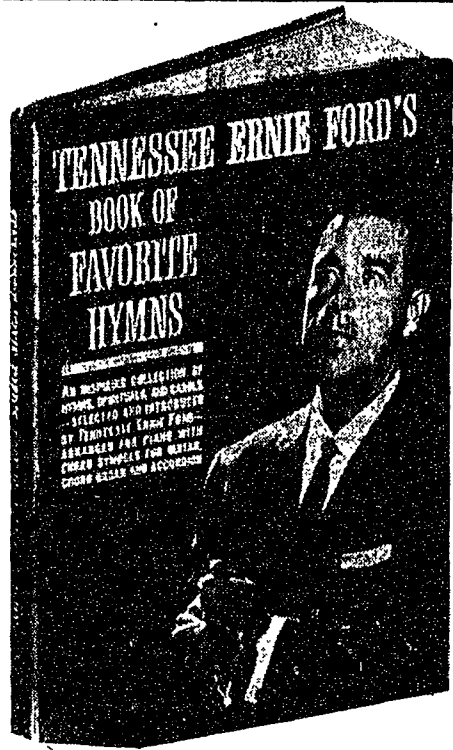
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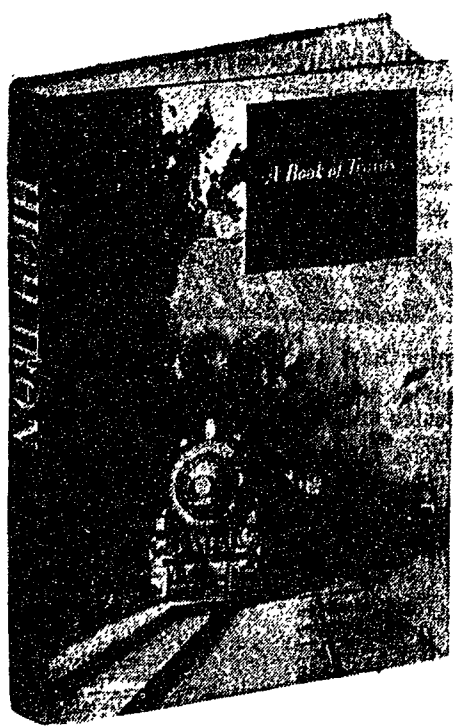
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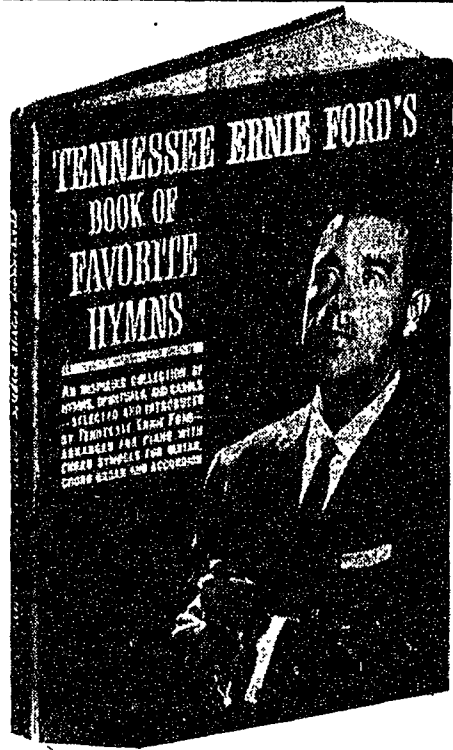
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
