

### Cromer To Head Youth Council Research Staff

Gov. Raymond P. Shafer has announced the appointment of William Cromer as Chairman of the Research Staff of the newly-formed Youth Advisory Council. Cromer will also act as chairman of the representatives of the north-central region of the state.

### Engineers' 'Spectrum' Features Interview with Congressman

Featured in this month's Spectrum, to go on sale today at the HUB and Engineering Library, is an interview with Congressman George P. Miller of California.

The interview with Congressman Miller is one of a series conducted by University of Illinois students on the relationship between government, science, and technology. Miller, who is chairman of the House Science and Astronautics Committee, comments on the "brain drain," the basis for allocation of funds for scientific and technological work, and problems such as air and water pollution and mass transit.

Other articles in Spectrum deal with two new stainless steel Lincoln Continental convertibles; a theory accounting for the earth's atmosphere; work done with chimpanzees on the effect of rapid decompression as part of the work on the U.S. space program; and comment on the effect mass populations have on the environment.
